Sark, or Man, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the Weft Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majelty's Forts and Settlements ou the Coalt of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ do first make Oath of the true Deltination of the fame to the Places for which it shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the fame shall be made, and do give full and sufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Cuttoms, to carry the faid Wood called Lig-num Vitæ to the Places for which it is fo entered Outwards, and none other; and fuch Bond fhall not be cancelled, or delivered up, until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the faid Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commiffioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manuer as shall be directed by the faid Commissioners, shewing that the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ has been duly landed at the Places for which it was entered Outwards: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the neceffary Directions herein as to them may refpec-Steph. W HEREAS by an Act paffed in the prefent Seffion of Parliament, intituled "An Act " to continue until the First Day of January One " thoufand eight hundred and three, and amend an " Act of the Thirty-ninth Year of the Reign of " His prefent Majefty for prohibiting the Export-" ation, and permitting the Importation of Corn, " and for allowing the Importation of other Ar-" ticles of Provision without Payment of Duty, and " to continue for the fame Period, an Act of the - last Seffion of Parliament for prohibiting the Exportation from Ireland of Corn, or Potatoes, or " other Provisions, and for permitting the Import-" ation into Ireland of Corn, Fish, and Provisions " without Payment of Duty;" It is, amongst other Things enacted, that it shall be lawful for His Majefty, his Heirs, and Succeffors, and he and they is and are thereby authorifed, with the Advice of his or their Privy Council, during the Continuance of the faid Act, from Time to Time, when, and as often as the fame shall be judged expedient, to prohibit generally, or under and fubject to fuch Re-Atrictions, Regulations, and Provisions, as shall be specified by His faid Majesty in any Order in Council, the Exportation from any Part of the United Kingdom of any Articles of Provision; and in like Manner to recall fuch Prohibition, either in Part or in the Whole, or to make any new Regulations, Restrictions, and Provisions relating thereto, as Circumstances may require, any Thing in any Act or Acts of Parliament, to the contrary thereof notwithflanding; His Majefty, by and with the Ad-

vice of His Privy Council, and in purfuance of the Powers given by the faid Act, is pleafed to order, and it is hereby ordered,) that for and during the pace of Six Months, to commence from the Date of this Order, no Person or Persons whosoever shall export, or fhall load or lay on board any Ship or Veffel, with the Intent to export from any Port or Place of Great Britain, any of the following Articles, viz. Bulls, Cows, Oxen, Calves, Sheep, Lamb, Swine, Beef, Pork, Mutton, Veal, Lamb, whether falted or otherwife, or any Beans, Butter, Onions, or Pulfe of any Sort, or any Barley-hulled, or Pearl-Barley: But it is His Majefly's Pleafure that nothing herein contained fhall extend, or be confirued to extend, to prevent the Exportation or carrying out of fuch and fo much of any of the faid Articles as shall be necessary to be carried in any Ship or Veffel on its Voyage out and Home for the Suftenance, Diet, and Support of the Commander, Mafter, Mariners, Paffengers, and others on board fuch Ship or Veffel, or for the Ule and Suftenance of the Cattle, Live Stock, or other Animals on board fuch Ship or Vellel; or for the neceffary victualling oc providing any of His Majefty's Ships of War, or other Ships and Veffels in His Majefty's Simps of War, or other Ships and Veffels in His Majefty's Service, or for the neceffary victualling or providing any of His Majefty's Forces, Forts, or Garrifons; nor to prohibit at any Time the Exportation of fuch and fo much of any of the faid Articles as may be neceffary for the Supply of the British Forts, Callles, or Factories in Africa, or of British Ships trading upon that Coast, which have usually been supplied with the fame from Great Britain; nor to prohibit the Exportation by the East India Company, or any Agent employed by them, of any of the faid Articles for the neceffary Supply of their Garrifons at St. Helena, Bombay, and Bencoolen, or the ne-ceffary Ufe of the Ships belonging to the faid Company; nor to prohibit the Exportation to the Islands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, or to any of His Majefty's Colonies, Iflands, or Plantations in America, or the Weft Indies, or to the Town or Port of Gibraltar, for the neceffary Use of the Inhabitants of the same respectively, in fuch Quantities as shall be judged to be necessary by the Lords of His Majefty's Most Honorable Privy Council, upon Application to be made from Time to Time, and under Licences to be granted by their Lordships; or without fuch Licences, provided Proof shall be made to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majelty's Customs, that the Articles fo to be exported as aforefaid, are

not of British Growth, Produce, or Manufacture : And His Majefty is hereby further pleafed to order, that nothing herein contained shall extend or be construed to extend to prohibit the Exportation from any Port of Great Britain to any Port of Ireland, of any of the Articles above-mentioned, provided the Perfons so exporting the same shall enter into Bonds, with sufficient Sureties, to the Satisfaction of the Commission of His Majesty's Customs, for the due landing thereof in the Ports in Ireland for which the same shall be respectively cleared out, and shall also comply with all other Conditions which now are or hereafter may be reguired by Law in respect to such Exportation :
