**T**HIS Day Monsieur Otto, Minister Plenipotentiary from the French Republic, had a private Audience of His Majesty, to deliver his Credentials:

To which he was introduced by the Right Honorable Lord Hawkesbury, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and conducted by Sir Stephen Cottrell, Knt. Master of the Ceremonies.

The King has been pleased to grant unto William Chambers Darling, of Glanford-Bridge, in the County of Lincoln, Doctor of Physic, His Royal Licence and Authority, that he and his Issue may take the Surname, and bear the Arms of Bagshaw only, in compliance with an Injunction in the last Will and Testament of William Bagshaw, late of Oakes, in the County of Derby, Esquire, deceased; such Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the Heralds' Office:

And also to order, that this His Majesty's Concession and Declaration be registered in His College of Arms.
