THE King, by His Majesty's Sign Manual, having been graciously pleased to grant the Proceeds of the Property captured at the Cape of Good Hope to General Sir Alured Clarke, K. B. and Admiral Lord Keith, K. B. in Trust, to be by them paid and distributed to the individual Captors, according to the Proportions described upon the said Royal Grant, and the Receipt of the said Money being immediately expected;

Notice is therefore hereby given, that all Persons entitled to share in the Property captured, as above, upon or subsequent to the 15th September 1795, will be paid their respective Proportions at the following Places, and in the Order and Manner hereafter described:
