Ireland, of any of the Articles above-mentioned, provided the Perfons fo exporting the fame fhall enter into Bonds, with fufficient Sureties, to the Satisfaction of the Commiffioners of His Majefty's Cuftoms, for the due landing thereof in the Ports in Ireland for which the fame fhall be refpectively cleared out, and fhall alfo comply with all other Conditions which now are or hereafter may be re-

quired by Law in respect to such Exportation: And His Majesty is hereby further pleased to order, that nothing herein contained shall extend or be construed to extend to prohibit, at any Time, any Perfon or Perfons from hipping or putting on board any of the Articles above-mentioned, to be carried from any Port, Creek, or Member, or Part of Great Britain, to any other Port, Creek, or Member, or Part of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, having fuch or the like Coaft Sufferance, Cocquet, or other Coaft-Dilpatch, for that Purpofe, and on fuch and the like Security being given for the landing and difcharging the fame as now is or hereafter may be by any Law or Laws, Act or Acts required in Relation to the carrying Coaftwife any Corn or other Articles, or any Goods, Wares, and Merchandize :- And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treafury are to give the neceffary Directions herein accordingly. ## PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS, in purfuance of the Powers V∀ vefted in His Majefty by an Act, passed in the Thirty-ninth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for enabling His Majefty to pro-" hibit the Exportation and permit the Importation " of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of tother Articles of Provision without Payment of " Duty, to continue in Force until Six Weeks from " the Commencement of the next Selfion of Parlia-" ment," (which Act, by fublequent Acts, has been further continued until Forty Days after the Commencement of the prefent Seffion of Parlia-ment,) His Majefty was pleafed, by His Order in Council, bearing Date the Tenth Day of December One thousand cight hundred, to order, (and it was thereby ordered,) That the Prohibition contained in an Order made, by His Majefly in Council, on the Sixteenth Day of October One thousand seven hundred and nine-y-nine, on the Esportation, or the loading or laying on board any Ship or Veffel with Intent to export, from any Poil or Place of Great Britain, any Wheat, Rye, Barley, Beer or Bigg, Peafe, Beans, Oats, or any kieal or Flour, or Bread, Bifcuit, or Malt made thereof, or any Indian Corn or Maize, or Meal or Flour made thereto, fhould be and continue in Force until the Expiration of Forty Days after the Commencement of the first Seffion of Parliament that should be begun and holden after the Firft Day of September One thoufand eight hundred and one ; excepting neverthelefs out of fuch Prohibition, any Foreign Corn, or Meal or Flour that fhould have been imported and awarehoused in the Manner and under the Conditions mentioned in an A&, paffed in the Thirty first Year

of His prefent Majefty's Reign, initiuled "An Act "for regulating the Importation and Exportation "of Corn, and the Payment of the Duty on "Foreign Corn imported, and of the Bounty on "Britifh Corn exported," and fhould not have been taken out of fuch Warehoufe for Home Confumption; and with Exception alfo as to the carrying Coaftwife or carrying out, or the Exportation of the feveral Sorts of Corn, or other Articles as aforefaid, from Great Britain, for any of the Purpofes mentioned in the faid Act:

And whereas His Majeftyswas alfo pleafed by His faid Order in Council of the Tenth Day of December One thousand eight hundred, to continue in like Manner, and for the like Term, the Liberty to import into any Port or Place of Great Britain any Foreign Corn, or other Articles as aforefaid, in any Britith Ship or Veffel, or in any other Ship or Veffel belonging to Perfons of any Kingdom or State in Amity with His Majefty, and navigated in any Manner whatever, without Payment of any Duty whatfoever; and alfo to take out of Warehoufe, for Home Coufumption, any fuch Foreign Corn, or other Articles as aforefaid, without Pay-ment of any Duty whatfoever; and likewife the Liberty to import into any Port or Place of Great Britain, in any British Ship or Veffel, or in any other Ship or Veffel belonging to Persons of any Kingdom or State in Amily with His Majefty, and navigated in any Manner whatever, without Pay-ment of any Duty whatfoever, any Beans called Kidney or French Beans, Tares, Lentiles, Cala-vances, and all other Sorts of Pulfe; and alfo Bulls, Cows, Oxen, Calves, Sheep, Lambs, and Swine; Beef, Pork, Mutton, Veal, and Lamb, whether falted or otherwife ; Bacon, Hams, Tongues, Butter, Cheefe, Potatoes, Rice, Sago, Sago-Powder, Tapioca, Vérmicelli, Millet-Seed, Poultry, Fowls, Eggs, Game, and Sour Crout ; Provided that a due Entry fhould be made of all fuch Articles as aforefaid, that should be fo imported, with the proper Officer of the Cultoms at the Port where the fame should be imported, under the Penalties and Forfeitures in the faid Act mentioned :

And whereas, by an Act, paffed in the prefent Seffion of Parliament, initialed "An Act to con-"tinue, until the Firlt Day of January One thou-"fand eight hundred and three, and amend an Act "of the Thirty-ninth Year of the Reign of His "prefent Majefty, for prohibiting the Exportation "and permitting the Importation of Corn, and "for allowing the Importation of other Articles of "Provision without Payment of Duty, and to "continue, for the fame Period, an Act of the laft "Seffion of Parliament, for prohibiting the Ex-"portation from Ireland of Corn or Potatoes, or "other Provisions, and for permitting the Import-"ation into Ireland of Corn, Fifth, and Provisions "without Payment of Duty," the faid Act, paffed in the Thirty-ninth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majelty, and the fubfequent Acts continuing the fame, are further continued until the Firlt Day of January One thousand eight hundred and three :

His Majefly is thereupou pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, and purfuant to the Powers fo veited in His Majefly, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That the faid Prohibition to export Corn, or any of the Articles as aforefaide
