The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS the Time limited by His Majelly's Order in Council of the Twenty-feventh Day of June last, prohibiting the Exportation into any Parts out of this Kingdom, of any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Mast, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Fourteenth of this inftant January : And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, and the Safety of this King-dom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for fome Time longer; His Majefty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whofoever do, at any Time, for the Space of Two Months, to commence from the Fourteenth Day of this inflant January, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Mafts, Yards, Bowfprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, or fhip or lace any of the Articles above-mentioned on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond to transporting the tame into any Parts beyond the Sens, without Leave or Permiflion being first had and obtained from His Majelty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures infifted by an Act, pailed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majelty's Reign, initialed "An Act to "enable His Majelty to reftrain the Exportation of it Naval Store and more effectively to remain the " Naval Stores, and more effectually to prevent the " Exportation of Salt-Petre, Arms, and Ammuni-⁴⁶ Exportation or Salt-1 ette, 111118, and 14111114 ⁴⁶ tion, when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in ⁴⁷ Council :¹⁷ But it is, neverthelefs, His Majefty's Pleafure, that nothing herein contained fhall ex-tend, or be conftrued to extend, to any of His Ma-⁴⁰ and ⁴¹ and ⁴¹ are any other Shine or Veficies iend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Ma-jefty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Veffels or Boats, in the Service of His Majefty's rem-ployed or freighted by His Majefty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commiltoners of His Ma-jefty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Veffel from taking or having on board fuch Quantities of Naval Stores as may be neceffary for the Use of

T the Court at St. James's, the 13th of Ja- | fuch Ship or Veffel during the Courfe of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commiffioners of the Admiralty for the Time being ; nor to the Exportation of the faid feveral Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonics or Plantations in America or the Weit Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Ifland of St. Helena, or to the Britilh Settlements or Factories in the Eaft Indies: Provided that, upon the Exportation of any of the faid Articles, for the Purpofes of Trade, to Ire-land, or to His Majefly's Yards or Garrifons, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the Weft Indies, or to the Ifland of Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the Eafl Indies, the Exporters of fuci Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the fame to the Places for which they shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commillioners of His Majefty's Cuftoms, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they are fo entered Out-wards, and for the Purpofes specified, and none other; and such Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up, until Proof be made, to the Satisfaction of the faid Commiffioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commilfioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commissioners, shewing that the faid Articles have been duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards. And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may refpectively appertain. Whereas it has been reprefented to His Majefly, that, on the 11th Day of December lafk, between Five and Six o'Clock in the Evening, Mr. George Jehn Hifeock, Deputy Searcher, and Mr. William Peddell, Coaftwalter, in the Service of the Cuffons at the Port of Portfmouth, were out upon Duty on South-Sea Common, they fell in with a large Gang of Snugglers, from fome of whom they feized Nine Cafks of Foreign Spirits; that about Half an Hour afterwards, as the faid Officers were removing the fail Cafks of Spirits, and conveying them to fome Houfe in the Neighbourhood to be there deposited for Security, Seven of the faid Snugglers came up to them, and in a refolute Manner demanded Reflitution of the faid Goods, which the Officers positively refufed, and being armed each with a Piflol and Sword, they warned them the faid Smugglers of the great Danger of the ferious Confequences if they attempted to take the fame foreibly away; but, difregarding this Caution, the faid Smugglers, in a very deferate Manner, attacked the faid Officers with large Pieces of Wood and Stones : Upon this the faid Officers, having told the Snugglers that them, and drew their Swords in order to defend themfelves, but the faid Seven Snugglers infantly closed upon the faid Officers and overpowered them, wrenched their Piflols out of their Hands, and, after beating and dangeroufly wounding them in a dreedful Manner, leaving them nearly doed, refewed and carried off the faid Cafks of Spirits which they the faid Officers had feized;
