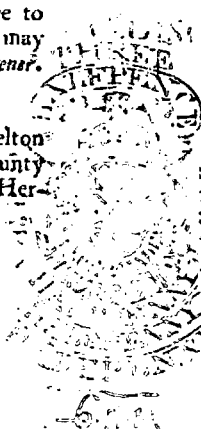
WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Twenty-seventh Day of June last, prohibiting the Exportation into any Parts out of this Kingdom, of any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Fourteenth of this instant January: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whosoever do, at any Time, for the Space of Two Months, to commence from the Fourteenth Day of this instant January, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, or ship or lade any of the Articles above-mentioned on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission being first had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act, passed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to enable His Majesty to refrain the Exportation of Naval Stores, and more effectually to prevent the Exportation of Salt-Petre, Arms, and Ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in Council:" But it is, nevertheless, His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majesty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Vessels or Boats, in the Service of His Majesty, or employed or freighted by His Majesty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Vessel from taking or having on board such Quantities of Naval Stores as may be necessary for the Use of

such Ship or Vessel during the Course of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being; nor to the Exportation of the said several Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies: Provided that, upon the Exportation of any of the said Articles, for the Purposes of Trade, to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of such Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Places for which they shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and sufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the said Articles to the Places for which they are so entered Outwards, and for the Purposes specified, and none other; and such Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up, until Proof be made, to the Satisfaction of the said Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the said Commissioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the said Commissioners, shewing that the said Articles have been duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards. And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

MEMORANDUM.

Captain Edward Bailey, of the 15th Foot, who was superseded in the Gazette of the 5th Instant, is reinstated in his Rank.

Whitehall, January 16, 1802.

Whereas it has been represented to His Majesty, that, on the 11th Day of December last, between Five and Six o'Clock in the Evening, Mr. George John Hiseock, Deputy Searcher, and Mr. William Peddell, Coastwailer, in the Service of the Customs at the Port of Portsmouth, were out upon Duty on South-Sea Common, they fell in with a large Gang of Smugglers, from some of whom they seized Nine Cases of Foreign Spirits; that about Half an Hour afterwards, as the said Officers were removing the said Cases of Spirits, and conveying them to some House in the Neighbourhood to be there deposited for Security, Seven of the said Smugglers came up to them, and in a resolute Manner demanded Restitution of the said Goods, which the Officers positively refused, and being armed each with a Pistol and Sword, they warned them the said Smugglers of the great Danger of the serious Consequences if they attempted to take the same forcibly away; but, disregarding this Caution, the said Smugglers, in a very desperate Manner, attacked the said Officers with large Pieces of Wood and Stones: Upon this the said Officers, having told the Smugglers that they were Officers of the Customs, fired their Pistols at them, and drew their Swords in order to defend themselves, but the said Seven Smugglers instantly closed upon the said Officers and overpowered them, wrenched their Pistols out of their Hands, and, after beating and dangerously wounding them in a dreadful Manner, leaving them nearly dead, rescued and carried off the said Cases of Spirits which they the said Officers had seized;

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in this Felony and Outrage, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one or more of the said Offenders who shall discover, his or their Accomplices, so that any one or more of them may be apprehended.

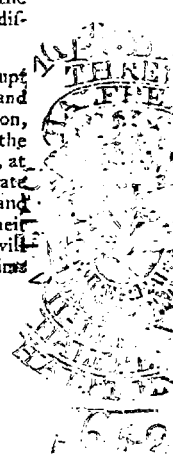
