THEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Second Day of December last, prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwife, Gunpowder or Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the Seventh Day of this inftant February: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever (except the Maller-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Two Months, to commence from the Seventh Day of this instant February, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder or Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder or Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coastwife, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majefty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act; passed in the Twenty-ninth Vear of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to empower His Ma-"jefty to prohibit the Exportation of Saltpetre, " and to enforce the Law for empowering His Ma-" jelly to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, " or any Sort of Arms and Ammunition; and also "6" to empower His Majcky to reftrain the carrying Coastwife of Saltpetre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition."—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treafury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at

HEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Second Day of December last, prohibiting the Transportation into any Parts out of this Kingdom, of the Wood called Lignum Vitæ, will expire upon the Tenth Day of this instant February: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whosoever do, at any Time during the Space of Two Months, to commence from the Tenth Day of this instant February, export, or attempt to export, transport, carry, or convey, or lade, or lay on board of any Ship, Vessel, or Boat, in order to be exported, transported, carried, or conveyed out of this Kingdom, any of the Wood called Lignum Vitx, without Leave or Permission being first had and obtained of His Majesty or His Privy Council: But it is, nevertheles, His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to prevent any Ship or Vessel from taking or having on board any of the said Wood called Lignum Vitæ, which may be necessary for the Use of the said Ship or Vessel during the Course of her intended Voyage; nor to prevent the Exportation of the faid Wood called Lignum Vitz to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Islands of Guerufey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, or to His Majetly's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Ports and Settlements on the Coast Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indie Provided that, upon the Exportation of the fait Wood called Lignum Vite to Ireland, or to Island.

7HEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council, of the Thirtieth of July One thousand eight hundred and one, prohibiting the exporting into any Parts beyond the Seas, within the Limits of Europe, of any Sheet Copper, or Copper in Boltstaves, Bars, Sheets, Rings, and Nails, or of Copper in fuch a State as may be easily converted into, or made uleful as a Naval Store, will expire upon the Twelfth Day of this instant February; And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, His Majesty doth, therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, and command, That no Person or Persons whosoever do, at any Time during the Space of Two Months, to commence from the faid Twelfth Day of this instant February, presume to export out of this Kingdom to any Parts beyond the Seas, within the Limits of Europe, any Sheet Copper, or Copper in Boltstaves, Bars, Sheets, Rings, and Nails, or any Copper capable of being converted into a Naval Store, or ship, or lade any of the Articles above-mentioned, on board any Ship or Vessel in order to exporting the same beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission being first had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act passed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majesty's Reign, Cap. 2. and also by an Act passed in the Thirty-fourth Year of His Ma-

jesty's Reign, Cap. 34: But it is nevertheless His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend or be construed to extend to the Exportation of any of the aforesaid Articles from Great Britain to Ireland, or from Ireland to Great Britain, respectively, or to any Exportation of any of the faid Articles, by, or on board of His Majesty's Ships of War, or any other Ships, or Vessels, or Boats in the Service of His Majesty, or employed or freighted by His Majesty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Vessel from taking or having on board such Quantities of the said Articles as may be necessary for the Use of such Ship or Vessel during the Course of her intended Voyage, or to any Exportation thereof by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or from the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being, or from the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland; nor to the Exportation of the said several Articles to His Majesty's Yards and Garrisons within the Limits of Europe, nor to the Exportation of any of the faid Articles to any Port or Place without the Limits of Europe, provided that in case of the Exportation to any Port or Place without the Limits of Europe, either of Copper being a Naval Store, or of Copper capable of being converted into a Naval Store, the Eventuer thereof do find into a Naval Store, the Exporters thereof do first make Oath of the true Destination of the said Articles to the Port or Place without the Limits of Europe, for which the same shall respectively be entered outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and sufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in Great Britain, or to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Revenue in Ireland, as the Case may be, to carry the said Articles to the Port or Place, without the Limits of Europe, for which the fame shall respectively be entered outwards, and fuch Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in Great Britain, or to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Revenue in Ireland, as the Case may be, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commissioners respectively, and specified in such Bond of a Certificate or Certificates in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the said Commissioners respectively, as the Case may be, thereby shewing that the faid Articles have been duly landed at the Port or Place, without the Limits of Europe, for which they were respectively entered outwards: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majetty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may re-W. WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Twentyeighth Year of the Reign of His present
Majesty, intituled "An Act for regulating the

"Trade between the Subjects of His Majesty's " Colonies and Plantations in North America, and " in the West India Islands, and the Countries belonging to the United States of America, and "between His Majesty's said Subjects, and the foreign Islands in the West Indies:" It is, amongst other Things, enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty in Council, by Order or Orders to be issued and published from Time to Time, to authorise, or by Warrant or Warrants under his Sign Manual, to empower the Governor of Newfoundland for the Time being, to authorife, in case of Necessity, the Importation into Newfoundland, of Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United States for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the then ensuing Season only; provided always that such Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, so authorised to be imported into the Island of Newfoundland shall not be imported, except in Conformity to such Rules, Regulations, and Restrictions as shall be specified in such Order or Orders, Warrant or Warrants respectively, and except by British Subjects, and in British built Ships owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law: And whereas it is expedient and necessary that Provision be made for fully supplying the Inhabitants or Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland for the ensuing Season, with Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, Rice, Live Stock, Salted Beef, Pork, Butter, Peale, and fuch other Articles of Provisions as may be wanted; His Majesty doth thereupon, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order and declare, that, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland for the ensuing Season only, Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, Rice, Live Stock, Salted Beef, Pork, Butter, Pease, and other Articles of Provisions may be imported into the said Island, from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United States, by British Subjects, and in British built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, and which shall, within the Space of Seven Months previous to the Time of such Importation, have cleared out from fome Port of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, or other His Majesty's Dominions in Europe, for which Purpose a Licence shall have been granted by the Commissioners of His Majelly's Customs in England or Scotland, or the Commif-fioners of His Majesty's Revenue in Ireland, or any other Person or Persons who may be duly authorised in that Kingdom, respectively, in the Manner and Form hereinaster mentioned, which Licence shall continue and be in force for Seven Calendar Months from the Day of the Date upon which fuch Licence is respectively granted, and no longer; provided that no such Licence as aforesaid, granted after the Thirtieth Day of September next, shall be of any force or effect: And His Majesty is hereby further pleased to order, that the Master or Person having the Charge or Command of any Ship or Vessel to whom such Licence shall be granted, shall, upon the Arrival of the said Ship or Vessel, at the Port, Harbour, or Place in the Island of Newfoundland, where he shall discharge such Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, Rice, Live Stock, Salted Beef,

Pork, Butter, Peale, and other Articles of Provision, deliver up the said Licence to the Collector or other proper Officer of the Customs there, having first indorfed on the Back of such Licence, the Marks, Numbers, and Contents of each Package of Bread, Flour, or Indian Corn, Rice, Salted Beef, Pork, Butter, Pease, and other Articles of Provision, and the Number of Live Stock under the Penalty of the Forfeiture in the faid Act mentioned; and the Collector or other proper Officer of the Customs at Newfoundland is hereby enjoined and required to give a Certificate to the Master or Person having the Charge or Command of such Ship or Vessel of his having received the faid Licence so indorfed as before directed, and to transmit the same to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in England or Scotland, or to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Revenue in Ireland, respectively, by whom such Licence was granted.
