Copy of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Rainier, Com-mander in Chief of His Majefly's Ships and Veffels in the East Indies, to Evan Mepean, Efg; dated in Madras-Road, the 29th of September 1801. SIR,

Have at prefent nothing very particular to com-municate to you, for their Lordships' Information, beyond what may be collected from the Difposition-Lift of His Majesty's Squadron under my Command, herewith enclosed, except the Capture' of the French National Frigate Chiffonne, in Mahé-Road, at the Seychelles, on the 19th Ultimo, Force

1.

T the Court at the Queen's-Houfe, the 17th of February 1802, Frigate's Forecafile-Guns, furnished with a Furnace for heating Red-Hot Shot, co-operated in her De-fence. This Circumstance, added to the Advantage the French Frigate derived from her Polition, being at Anchor, while His Majelty's Ship had to fleer for her Opponent, at the greateft Hazard, through a winding and intricate Channel, formed by various dangerous Shoals, with no other Guide than as the Water was feen to difcolour on them by a Man at the Mast-Head, placed there for that Purpole, may be fairly estimated to overbalance the trifling Dif-ference in the Calibre of the Metal of the Enemy's Ship, and juftly entitle Captain Adam, his Officers, and Crew to the diffinguished Honor of having taken a Ship of equal Force.

The Chiffonne was commanded by a Monfieur Guieyffe, failed from Nantes 14th April laft, is a fine new Ship, had never been at Sea before, completely armed and equipped; her Errand to the Sey-chelles was to land Thirty-two Perfons who had been hafpefted of being concerned in an Attempt on the Like of the First Conful of the French Republic. As His Majefly's Ship Suffolk will pro-ceed flortly with Convoy to Spithead, I fhall defer to that Opportunity the forwarding a Copy of Captain Addin's Letter on the Occasion, with other Particulars; but it may be proper to acquaint you that, on the 15th of May, near the Coast of Brazil, the Chiffonne took a Portuguese Schoner; and Three Days after a Frigate of that Nation, named L'Hirondelle, armée en flute, with Twenty-four Carronades, Twenty-four Pounders, after a flort Action, but after throwing her Guns overboard, and taking out her Stores, fuffered her to go about her Bufinefs, the Captain and Officers giving their Parole for themfelves and Crew. On the 16th of June, off the Cape, fhe captured the English Ship Bellona, laden with a very valuable Cargo, from Calcutta bound to England, who got fafe into the Mauritius. I have only to add that I have given Orders for the Purchafg of the Chiffonne for His Majelly's
