The KING's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's VV Order in Council of the Second Day of December last, prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coaftwife, Gunpowder or Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the Seventh Day of this inflant February: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service that the faid Prohibition fhould be continued for fome Time longer; His Majefty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfer or Perfons whatfoever (except the Master General of the Ordnance for His Majefty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Two Months, to commence from the Seventh Day of this inftant February, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coaftwife, any Gunpowder or Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or Ihip or lade any Gunpowder or Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the lame Coaftwife, without Leave or Permillion in that Behalf first without Leave or Perminion in that Behav hith obtained from His Majeity, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the refpective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act, paffed in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majefty's Reign, intituled "An Act to empower His Ma-" jefty to prohibit the Exportation of Saltpetre, "I and to enforce the Tart for any for any any any any set " and to enforce the Law for empowering His Ma-" jefty to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, " or any Sort of Arms and Ammunition ; and allo " to empower His Majelly to reftrain the carrying " Coaffwife of Saltpetre, Gunpowder, or any Sort " of Arms or Ammunition."—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majeliv's Treafury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General Provided that, upon the Exportation of the faid of the Ordnance, and His Majelty's Secretary at Wood called Lignum Vitæ to Ireland, or to His

ITHEREAS the Time limited by His Majelty's Order in Council of the Second Day of December laft, prohibiting the Transportation into any Parts out of this Kingdom, of the Wood called Lig-num Witz, will expire upon the Tenth Day of this instant February: And whereas it is judged ex-pedient for His Majelty's Service that the faid Prohibition (hould be continued for fome Time longer; His Majelty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Perfons wholoever do, at any Time during the Space of Two Months, to commence from the Tenth Day of this inflant February, export, or attempt to export, transport, carry, or convey, or lade, or lay on board of any Ship, Veffel, or Boat, in order to be exported, tranfported, carried, or conveyed out of this Kingdom, any of the Wood called Lignum Vitæ, without Leave or Permifion being first had and obtained of His Majelty or His Privy Council : But it is, neverthelels, His Majelty's Pleafure, that nothing herein contained fhall extend, or be confirued to extend, to prevent any Ship or Veffel from taking or having on board any of the faid Wood cailed Lignum Vitæ, which may be ucceffary for the 'Ule of the faid Ship or Veffel during the Courfe of her intended Voyage; nor to prevent the Ex-portation of the fuid Wood called Lignum Vitæ to Ireland, or to His Majefty's Islands of Guern. fev, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, or to His Majelly's Colonies or Plantations in America or the Welt Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies:
