PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. IS Majefty having been pleafed to appoint Henry Bentinck, Efquire, Captain-General and Governor in Chief of the Island of St. Vincent, Bequia, and fuch other of the Islands commonly called the Grenadines, as lie to the Northward of the Island of Cariacou, in America, he, this Day, took the ufual Oaths appointed to be taken by the Governors of His Majelty's Plantations.

IS Majefty, in Council, was this Day pleafed to appoint Sir John Davie, of Creedy, Baronet, to be Sheriff of the County of Devon.

HIS Day the Lords being met, a Message was fent to the Honorable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Usher of the Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Omer of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, au-thorifed by wirtue of His Majefly's Commission for de-claring His Royal Affent to feveral ABs agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honorable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commillion read ; and the Commons being come thither, the faid Commiffion, empowering the Lord Arch-bishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and feveral other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Affent to the faid A&s, was read accordingly, and the Royal Affent given to

An Act for railing a further Sum of Money, by Loans or Exchequer Bills, for the Service of Great Britain for the Year One thousand eight hundred and two.

An Act for continuing the Premiums allowed to Ships employed in and for enlarging the Limits of the Southern Whale Fifhery.

An Act to amend so much of an Act made in the Twenty-ninth Year of the Reign of His late Ma-jefty King George the Second, intituled An Act for explaining, amending, and rendering more effectual an Act made in the Twenty-Second Year of His prefent Majefty's Reign, intituled An Act for making a Free Market for the Sale of Fifh in the City of Weftminfter, and for preventing the fore-ftalling and monopolizing of Fifh, and for allowing the Sale of Fish, under the Dimensions mentioned in a Claufe contained in an A& of the First Year of His late Majesty's Reign, in case the same are taken with a Hook, as relates to the Sale of Eels.

An Act for continuing the Term, and altering and enlarging the Powers of Two Acts, the one paffed in the Thirteenth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefty for more effectually amending feveral Roads leading from and near the Borough of Truro, in the County of Cornwall, and for building and keeping in Repair a Bridge over the River at a Place called the Steppings, in and near the faid Borough; and the other paffed in the Twenty-fecond Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for extending the Provisions of the faid former Act to the feveral other Roads therein defcribed.
