HEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Thirteenth Day of January last, prohibiting the Exportation into any Parts out of this Kingdom, of any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Fourteenth Day of this instant March: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer; His Majefly doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whofoever do, at any Time, for the Space of Two Months, to commence from the Fourteenth Day of this instant March, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval. Stores, (except as excepted by His Majesty's Order.]

T the Court at the Queen's House, the 3d of | in Council of the Twelfth of February last, continuing the Provisions of a former Order made by His Majesty, in Council, on the Thirtieth July One thousand eight hundred and one, whereby the Exportation to any Port or Place without the Limits of Europe, either of Copper being a Naval Store, or of Copper capable of being converted. into a Naval Store, was allowed under the Terms and Conditions expressed in the said Order,) or ship or lade any of the Articles abovementioned on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts' beyond the Seas, (except as above excepted,) without Leave or Permission being first had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act, passed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An A& to " enable His Majesty to restrain the Exportation of " Naval Stores, and more effectually to prevent the "Exportation of Salt-Petre, Arms, and Ammuni-" tion, when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in "Council:" But it is, nevertheless, His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majesty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Vessels or Boats, in the Service of His Majesty, or employed or freighted by His Majesty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Vessel from taking or having on board fuch Quantities of Naval Stores as may be necessary for the Use of fuch Ship or Vessel during the Course of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being; nor to prevent the Exportation of the faid feveral Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America: or the Well Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His-Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of s Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies: 1 Provided that, upon the Exportation of any of the faid Articles, for the Purpofes of Trade, to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indics, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of such Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the fame to the Places for which they shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they are fo entered Outwards, and for the Purposes specified, and none other; and fuch Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up, until Proof be made, to the Satisfaction of the faid Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commiffioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commissioners, shewing that the faid Articles have been duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards. And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain. The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by an Act passed in the Twenty-eighth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for regulating the "Trade between the Subjects of His Majesty's "Colonies and Plantations in North America, and "in the West India Islands, and the Countries be-"longing to the United States of America, and between His Majesty's said Subjects, and the "foreign Islands in the West Indies:" It is, amongst other Things, enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty in Council, by Order or Orders to be issued and published from Time to Time, to authorise, or by Warrant or Warrants under his Sign Manual, to empower the Governor of Newfoundland for the Time being, to authorise, in case of Necessity, the Importation into Newfoundland, of Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United States for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the then ensuing Season only; provided always that such Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, so authorised to be imported into the Island

of Newfoundland, shall not be imported, except in Conformity to fuch Rules, Regulations, and Restrictions as shall be specified in such Order or Orders, Warrant or Warrants respectively, and except by British Subjects, and in British built Ships owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law: And whereas it is expedient and necessary that Provision be made for fully supplying the Inhabitants or Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland for the enfuing Season, with Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, Rice, Live Stock, Salted Beef, Pork, Butter, Peale, and fuch other Articles of Provisions as may be wanted; His Majesty doth thereupon, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order and declare, that, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland for the ensuing Season only, Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, Rice, Live Stock, Salted Beef, Pork, Butter, Peafe, and other Articles of Provisions may be imported into the faid Island, from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United States, by British Subjects, and in British built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, and which shall, within the Space of Seven Months previous to the Time of such Importation, have cleared out from some Port of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, or other His Majesty's Dominions in Europe, for which Purpose a Licence shall have been granted by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in England or Scotland, or the Commiffioners of His Majesty's Revenue in Ireland, or any other Person or Persons who may be duly authorised in that Kingdom, respectively, in the Manner and Form hereinafter mentioned, which Licence shall continue and be in force for Seven Calendar Months from the Day of the Date upon which fuch Licence is respectively granted, and no longer; provided that no such Licence as aforesaid, granted after the Thirtieth Day of September next, shall be of any force or effect: And His Majesty is hereby surther pleased to order, that the Master or Person having the Charge or Command of any Ship or Vessel to whom such Licence shall be granted, shall, upon the Arrival of the said Ship or Vessel at the Pert, Harbour, or Place in the Island of Newfoundland, where he shall discharge such Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, Rice, Live Stock, Salted Beef, Pork, Butter, Peafe, and other Articles of Provision, deliver up the faid Licence to the Collector or other proper Officer of the Cultoms there, having first indorfed on the Back of fuch Licence, the Marks, Numbers, and Contents of each Package of Bread, Flour, or Indian Corn, Rice, Salted Beef, Pork, Butter, Peafe, and other Articles of Provision, and the Number of: Live Stock, under the Penalty of the Forfeiture in the faid Act mentioned; and the Collector, or other proper Officer of the Customs at Newfoundland is hereby enjoined and required to give a Certificate to the Master or Person having the Charge or Command of such Ship or Veffel of his having received the faid Licence so indorsed as before directed, and to transmit the same to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in England or Scotland, or to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Revenue in Ireland, respectively, by whom such Licence was granted. W Hereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that on the 15th Day of December last, about Eleven o'Clock at Night, as Two Boats, manned with the Crews of the Tartar and Lively Cutters, in the Service of the Customs, were out upon Duty in the Docuns, and proceeding along Shore they discovered a Lugger, to which they gave Chace, and on their nearing of the People on board the Lugger ordered the Crew of the Tartar's and Lively's Boats to keep off, and threatened to fire into them and fink and defroy them, and immediately fired one Musket; That notwithstanding this Resistance the Crews of the Tartar's and Lively's Boats succeeded in boarding the said Lugger, and drove the Crew, consisting of Twenty-two Men, overboard, in effecting which, one of the Crew of the Tartar was wounded and another thrown overboard; that the faid Lugger got aground on the Beach, near the Town of Deal, and she proved to be the Ned of Deal, laden with a large Quantity of snuggled Goods, a great Part of which they seized and secured, and sent on board the Tartar Cutter; that in about an Hour afterwards as the Crews of the faid Tartar's and Lively's Boats were endeavouring to heave the faid Lugger off they were attacked by a great Number of Snugglers who came down upon the Beach armed with Muskets, within Half Pistol-Shot of them, and kept up a constant Fire of Musketry, which the Grew of the Tartar's and Lively's Boats returned for some Time, when finding it impossible to get the Lugger off and being overpowered by Superior Numbers, they quitted her, the Smugglers on the Beach fill continuing to fire upon them until they got out of Sight; that in the Course of this Attack Two of the Crew of the Lively's Boat were wounded, one of them dangerously; that some Time after this the Smugglers rescued and carried off the said Lugger, and the same has not fince been heard of;
