

Hackney Coach-Office, March 2, 1802.

WHereas by an Act of Parliament passed in the Fortieth Year of His present Majesty, the Commissioners for licensing and regulating Hackney Coaches and Chairs, were authorized and directed, whenever the Average Price of Oats should exceed Twenty-five Shillings per Quarter, to add the Proportion of Twenty-five per Cent. or One-Fourth to certain Rates and Fares therein specified, and to continue the same till the Average Price of Oats, as published in the London Gazette, should be reduced to One Guinea per Quarter: And whereas in the London Gazette of last Saturday (and not before,) the 27th of February, such Average of One Guinea per Quarter was published, the said Commissioners do hereby inform the Public, and order and direct the Owners of Hackney Coaches, that from and after Tuesday next, the 9th Instant, the said Addition of Twenty-five per Cent. shall cease.
