## PRESENT,

The KING's Moit Excellent Majefty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the Thirteenth Day of January laf, prohibiting the Exportation into any Parts out of this Kingdom, of any Pig-Iton, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Mafts, Yards, Bowfrrits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Fourteenth Day of this inflant March : And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, that the faid Prohibition fhould be continued for fome Time longer; His Majety doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whofoever d, at any Time, for the Space of Two Months, to commence from the Fourteenth Day of this inflant March, prefume to tranfport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, any Pig-Iron, BarIron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Matts, Yards, Borfprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, (exsept as excepted by His Majelty's Order in Council of the Twelfth of February laft, continuing the Provifions of a former Order made by His Majefty, in Council, on the Thirtieth .July One thoufand eight hundred and one, whereby the Exportation to any Port or Place without the Limits of Europe, either of Copper being a Naval Store, or of Copper capable of being converted into a Naval Store, was allowed under the Terms and Conditions expreffed in the faid Order, ) or fhip or lade any of the Articles abovementioned on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to tranfporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, (except as above excepted, ) without Leave or Permifion being firft had and obtained from His Majefty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring, the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act, paffed in the. Thirty-tliurd Year of His Majefty's Reign, intituled "An Act to " enable His Majefly to reffrain the Expertation of
"Naval Stores, and more effectually to prevent the
"Exportation of Salt-Petre, Arms, and Ammuni-
«t tion, when prolibited by Proclamation or Order in "Council::" But it is, neverthelefs, His Majefty's Pleafure, that nothing herein contained frall extend, or be conftrued to extend, to any of His Majefty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Veffels or Boats, in the Service of His Majetty, or employed or freighted by His. Majefty's Board of Orduance, or by the Commiflioners of His Majefty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Veffel from taking or having on board fuch Quantities of Naval Stores as may be .neceffary for the Ufe of fuch Ship or Veffel during the Courfe of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commiffioners of the Admiralty for the Time being; nor to prevent the Exportation of the faid feveral Articles to Ireland, ur to His Majelty's Yards or Garrifons, or to His Majelty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the Weft Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majefy's Forts and Settlements on the Coalt of Africa, or to the Inland of St. Helena, or to the Britifl Settlements or Fatories in the Eaft Indies: Provided that, upon the Exportation of any of the faid Articies, for the Purpofes of Trade, to Ireland, or to His Majefty's Yards or Garrifons, or to His Majefy's Colonies and Plantations in America or the Weft Indies, or to the Illand of New. foundland, or to His Majeft's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Ifland of St. Helena, or to the Britih Sertiements or Factories in the Eaft Indies, the Exporters of fuch Articles do firt make Oath of the true Deffination of the fame to the Places for which they fhall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the fame fhall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of, the Commiffioners of His Majefty's Cuftoms, to carry the faid Articles tos the Places for which they are fo entered'Outwards, and for the Purpofes fpecified, and none other; and fuch Bond fhall not be cancelled or delivered up, until Proof be made, to the Satisfaction of the faid Commiffioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commiffioners, and fpecified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as frall be directed by the faid Comniffioners, fhewing that the faid Articles have heen duly landed at the Places for which they wre entered Outwards. Whitehall, March 2, i80z. ThTHereas it bas been bumbly reprefented to the King, that on ihe 15th. Day of December laft, about Eleven o'Clock at Night,' as Truo Boats, manned with the Crews of the Tartar and Lively Cutters, in the Service of the Cufoms, wert out upon Duty in the Downs, and proceeding along Shore they difcovered a Lugser, to which they gave Chace, and on their nearing ber, the People on biard the Lagger ordered the Creao of the Tariar's and Lively's Boats to keep off, and threatened to fire into them and fink and deftroy them, and immediately fircd one Mu/ket; That not wuith/位ding this Refflane the Ciews of the Tartar's and Livi'y's Boats fircceeded in boarding the fuid Lugger, and diove the Crezu, conffiling of Twenty two Men, overboards in effcing which, one of the Crezu of the Tartar was wounded and another thrown overboard; that the faid Lugger got agronind on the Beach, near the Town of Deal, and Jbe proved to be the Ned of Deal, laden with a large $\mathcal{Q}$ unntity of fmuggled Goods, a great Part of cubich they feized and fectured, and fent on board the Tartar Cutter: that in about an Hour afterwards as the Crews of the faid Tartar's and Lively's Bcats were endeavouring to beave the faid Lugger off they were attacked by a great Number of Smugglers nuho came down woon the Beach armed with Mughet;, within Half Pifol-Shot of them, and kept up a conflait Fire of. Mufketry, which the Creco of the Tartar's ard Lively's Bouts returned for fome Time, when finding it impaffible to get the Lugger off and being overparvered by fuperior. Numbers, they quilted her, the Smugglerson the Beach fill continuing to fire upon then until they got out of Sight; that in the Courfe of this Attack. Two of the Ciew of the Lively's Beat were wounded, one of them dangeroufly; that fome Time after this the Smugglers refcued and carried off the faid Lugyer, and the fame has not fince been beard of;
