WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Thirteenth Day of January last, prohibiting the Exportation into any Parts out of this Kingdom, of any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Fourteenth Day of this instant March: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whosoever do, at any Time, for the Space of Two Months, to command from the Force of the Power of the do, at any Time, for the Space of Two Months, to commence from the Fourteenth Day of this instant March, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, (except as excepted by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Twelfth of February last, continuing the Provisions of a former Order made by tinuing the Provisions of a former Order made by His Majesty, in Council, on the Thirtieth July One thousand eight hundred and one, whereby the Exportation to any Port or Place without the Limits of Europe, either of Copper being a Naval Store, or of Copper capable of being converted into a Naval Store, was allowed under the Terms and Conditions expressed in the said Order,) or ship or lade any of the Articles abovementioned on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, (except as above excepted,) without Leave or Permission being first had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act, passed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to "enable His Majesty to restrain the Exportation of Naval Stars and more of Carellana and the Council Stars and more of Carellana and the Council Stars and more of Carellana and the Carellana

Whitehall, March 2, 1802. Hereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that on the 15th Day of December last, about Eleven o' Clock at Night, as Two Boats, manned with the Crews of the Tartar and Lively Cutters, in the Service of the Customs, were out upon Duty in the Downs, and proceeding along Shore they discovered a Lugger, to which they gave Chace, and on their nearing her, the People on board the Lugger ordered the Crew of the Tartar's and Lively's Boats to keep off, and threatened to fire into them and fink and destroy them, and immediately fired one Musket; That not withstanding this Resistance the Crews of the Tartar's and Live'y's Boats succeeded in boarding the faid Lugger, and drove the Crew, confishing of Twenty two Men, overboard, in effecting which, one of the Crew of the Tartar was amounted and another thrown overhoard, that the list wounded and another thrown overboard; that the faid Lugger got aground on the Beach, near the Town of Deal, and she proved to be the Ned of Deal, laden with a large Quantity of smuggled Goods, a great Part of which they seized and secured, and sent on board the Tartar Cutter; that in about an Hour afterwards as the Crews of the faid Tartar's and Lively's Boats were endeavouring to beave the faid Lugger off they were attacked by a great Number of Smugglers who came down upon the Beach armed with Mufket:, within Half Pistol-Shot of them, and kept up a constant Fire of Musketry, which the Crew of the Tartar's and Lively's Boats returned for some Time, when finding it impossible to get the Lugger off and being overpowered by superior. Numbers, they quitted her, the Smugglers on the Beach fill continuing to fire upon them until they got out of Sight; that in the Course of this Attack. Two of the Crew of the Lively's Boat were wounded, one of them dangeroufly; that some Time after this the Smugglers rescued and carried off the said Lugger, and the sume has not fince been heard of;

Hereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that on the 17th Day of December last, about Seven o' Clock in the Evening, as Mr. James Ireland, Mate of the Tartar Cutter, in the Service of the Cufioms, flationed at the Port of Dover, was upon Duty in the Six-Oared Boat, off Walmer, together with some of the Crew of the said Cutter, they fell in with a Smuggling Lugger, and followed her to the Town of Deal, where she anchored, and the Officer then boarded her: —That as the faid Officer and his Men were in the act of getting the faid Lugger off, a great Number of Boats full of Men, to the Amount of One Hundred and Boats jull of Islen, to the Amount of One Hundred and Fifly or more, were launched from the Shore of Deal, and came along fide of the faid Smuggling Lunger, and, with threatening Oaths, struck the faid Officer and his Boat's Crew several Times, and at last compelled them to leave the said Lugger through Fear of being killed by the Smugglers, one of whom took a Pissol out of one of the Hands of the Tartar's Boatmen, and presented it to

him, but it flashed in the Pan and missed Fire;

And, as a further Encouragement, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs do hereby promise a Reward of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS to any Person or Persons who shall discover and apprehend, or cause and procure to be discovered and apprehended, any One or more of the said Offenders, to be paid by the Receiver-General of His Majesty's Gustoms upon Conviction.
