rears of Subfilies due to his Mafter. From Spain we have an Account, that the King had finally Refolved to furnish his Committioners at Courtray with a new Power, in which the Title of Burgundy fhould be left out.

. Bruffels, Sept. 13- Since our laft, an Extraordinary Courier arrived here from Madrid, who brought a new Power for the Commissioners at Courtray, and Bills of Exchange for a confiderable fum of Money, to be paid to the Duke de Villa Hermoja. Yeflerday we had a violent Storm, with Thunder and Lightning, and we have an Account, that the Paffage-Boat that went from Antwerp to Villabrook was calt away, and that of above 80 Paffengers, there was not one faved. The Marquis de Bourgomanero, Ambaffador from the King of Spain to the Emperor, has all his Difpatches, and will begin his Joinncy in a day or two; but Don Bernardo de Salinas, who goes to Denmark, is not fo ready. To morrow or next day at farthest, the Spanish Commissioners at Courtray will exhibit their new Powers. The troubles at Liege increase daily; the People continue in Arms, have committed many Infolencies, pulled down the Cuftom-Houfe, Affaulted, and wounded the Officers, and will neither obey the Edicts of their Prince the Bishop of Liege, nor of the Emperer.

Bruges, Sept. 14. The States of Flanders have at length confented to raife 14000 Rations a day, for the enfuing year, which is 8000 lefs than what they gave the laft. The three Regiments of Horfe that were at the Rendezvous at Demile, are returned to their Quarters. The Forces that are in this Province, have been very punctually paid by the States, according to the fettlement made fince the Peace, till within their two Months, which makes the Soldiers not on y complain, but puts them upon committing feveral diforders, its probable they would not otherwife be guilty of. The Ships that are to carry his Excellencies Baggage for Spain, lye ready at Oftend.

Paris, Sept. 14. The Duchels of Orleans has by an Express received Advice, of the death of her Father the Elector Palatine. The Prince of Conde contimuesill of an Ague. Preparations are making, to entertain the Court with a great Ball on St. Huberis day.

Deal, Sept. 10. The Ships that are arrived from the west-Indies are the George, the Golden Fleece, and the Success from that Coast, and the Casar from Bantam. We do not yet hear of the Hunter Frigat, who came from *Famaica*, in company of those Ships that are arrived from thence.

Oxford, Sept., 10. The 8th Inflant in the Evening, his Highnels the Electoral Prince Palatine, came hither in one of his Majeflies Coaches from London, accompanied by Sir Charles Cotterel, Malter of the Ceremonies. His Highness being come near the Town, Mr. Howard, Son to the Earl of Carl fle, accompanied with feveral Gentlemen on Horfeback, met his Highness, and made him a Compliment in the name of the Vice-Chancellor, and the Heads of Houles, who met his Highness at St. Maries; the Prince coming out of his Coach, to Receive and Return their Compliments at Chrifts-Church the Bithop of Oxford received him, and Contucted him to his Apartment. The next morn ng his Highnefs went to fee the Colledges, ( where he had feveral Speeches made to him, and at some of them, was

at the publick Prayers ) the Library, and the Phyfick Garden, and in the afternoon there was a Convocation at the Theater, where his Highness was pleafed to take his Degree of Doctor of Phyfick ; feveral Gentlemen of his Retinue, having likewise Degrees given them. This day his Highnel's parted again from hence extreamly fatisfied with the Refpects shown him by the University and my bord Bishop who Entertained his Highness and all his Attendants very Magnificently during their whole flay here.
