HIS Day the Lords being met, a Message was fent to the Honorable Honle of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Ufher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, au-thorifed by virtue of His Majefly's Commission for de-claring His Royal Affent to feveral AEIs agreed upon by both Houses, do defire the immediate Attendance of this Honorable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commiffion read; and the Commons being come thither, the faid Commiffion, empowering the Lord Arch-bishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and feveral other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Affent to the faid Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Affent given to .

An Act for railing the Sum of One Million by Loans or Exchequer Bills for the Service of Great Britain for the Year One thousand eight hundred and two.

An Act to repeal the Duties on Cinnamon imported by the East India Company, and on Caffia Lignea of all Sorts, and for granting new Duties in lieu thereof; and to repeal the Cuftom Duties on certain Hydes and Skins; and to repeal certain Duties granted by an Act of the last Session of Par-liament upon Box Wood imported, and granting new Duties in lieu thereof.

An Act to indemnify fuch Perfons as have omitted to qualify themfelves for Offices and Employments, and to indemnify Juffices of the Peace or others who have omitted to regilter or deliver in their Qualifications within the Time directed by Law, and for extending the Time limited for those Purposes until the Twenty-fifth Day of December One thousand eight hundred and two, to indemnify Members and Officers in Cities, Corporations, and Borough Towns, whole Admissions have been omitted to be flamped according to Law, or having been stamped, have been lost or millaid, and for allowing them until the Twenty-fifth Day of December One thousand eight hundred and two, to provide Admissions duly stamped; to permit fuch Persons as shave omitted to make and file Affidavits of the Execution of Indentures of Clerks to Attornies and Solicitors to make and file the fame on or before the First Day of Michaelmas Term One thoufand eight hundred and two; to allow, until the Twenty fourth Day of December One thousand eight hundred and two, Perfons who have omitted to pay the Duties on the Indentures and Contracts of Clerks, Apprentices, or Servants to make Payment of the fame; to indemnify fuch Perfons as have neglected to obtain Certificates of Admission as Solicitors or Attornies, Notaries or Proctors, and for extending the Time limited for that Purpole until Two Months after the palling of this Act ; to indemnify Perfors who have printed or published Pleadings and other Proceedings in Courts of Law An Act for repairing, widening, improving, and or Equity upon which the Name and Place of keeping in Repair the Road leading from the Shire-

Abode of the Printer has not been printed ; and for indemnifying Deputy Lieutenants and Officers of the Militia, who have neglected to traufmit Defcriptions of their Qualifications to the Clerks of the Peace within the Time directed by Law, and for extending the Time limited for that Purpofe, until the First Day of September One thousand eight hundred and two.

An AA for making perpetual fo much of an AA made in the Nineteenth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefty as relates to the allowing a Drawback of the Duties on Rum shipped as Stores to be confumed on board Merchant Ships on their Voyages; and to continue feveral Laws relating to the permitting the Expostation of Tobacco Pipe Clay from Great Britain to the British Sugar Colonies in the Weft Indies until the Twenty-fourth Day of June One thousand eight hundred and eight; to the giving further Encouragement to the Importation of Naval Stores from the British Colonies in America, until the Twenty-ninth Day of September One thousand eight hundred and twelve; to the regulating the Payment of the Daties on Cinnamon, Cloves, Nutmegs, and Mace; to the allowing the Importation of certain Fifh from Newfoundland and the Coaft of Labrador until the Twenty-fourth Day of June One thousand eight hundred and eight; and to the allowing the Importation and Exportation of Goods from and to India and China in Ships not of British-built during the Continuance of the exclusive Trade to and from the East Indies granted to the East India Company by an Act of the Thirtythird Year of His prefent Majefty's Reign. An Act for continuing until the Twenty-fifth

Day of December One thousand eight hundred and four, the Bounties granted for the Encouragement of the Greenland Whale Fisheries, and for continuing and amending the Regulations respecting the fame.

An Act for repairing, altering, widening, and improving the Road leading from the City of Canterbury to the Town of Ramfgate, in the Isle of Thanet, in the County of Kent; and for fulpend-ing and varying, for a limited Time, fo much of an Act, paffed in the Twenty-feventh Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, as relates to the Toll-Gate, and to the Tolls now payable by virtue of the faid Act on the Road leading from the faid City of Canterbury to the Ifle of Thanet.

An A& for repairing, altering, widening, and improving the Road leading from the City of Canterbury to the Town and Port of Sandwich, in the County of Kent.

An A& for continuing the Term, and altering and enlarging the Powers of Two Acts paffed in the Thirty-third Year of the Reign of His late Majefty King George the Second, and the Twentyfirst Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, for repairing and widening the Road leading from the Turnpike-Road near the Welt End of the Town of Chefterfield; to Matlock Bridge; and also the Road leading out of the faid Road, over Darley-Bridge, to Crofs-Green ; and also the Road leading out of the faid last-mentioned Road to the Turnpike-Road near Rowelly-Bridge, all in the County of Derby.
