THE King has been pleased to present the Reverend ——— Kennedy to the Church and Parish of Applecrofs, in the Presbytery of Lochcarton, and County of Ross, vacant by the Translation of the Reverend John Macqueen to the Church and Parish of Gairlock.

Whitehall, March 20, 1802.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that on the Night of Thursday the 4th Day of February last, the Dog Kennel, belonging to Dame Dorothy Mill, at Arlingham, in the County of Gloucester, was maliciously set on fire by some Person or Persons unknown, whereby the same was totally destroyed, and that on the same, or following Night, Part of the Sea Bank or Wall, in a Field called Horscroft Field, in the said Parish of Arlingham, belonging to her was unawfully and maliciously cut down by some Person or Persons unknown, whereby a valuable Tract of Land of several Hundred Acres, was in Danger of being overflowed and greatly damaged;

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the above Felonies and Outrages, or either of them, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of such Persons (except the Person who actually set fire to the said Dog Kennel,) who shall discover his or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof. **PELHAM.**

And, as a further Encouragement, a Reward of **FIFTY POUNDS** is hereby offered by the said Dame Dorothy Mill, to any Person making such Discovery as aforesaid, of the setting fire to the said Dog Kennel, (except as is before excepted,) to be paid on the Conviction of any one or more of the Offenders.
