WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the Third Day of February laft, prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coaftwife, Gunpowder or Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the Seventh Day of April next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service that the faid Prohibition fhould be continued for fome Time longer; His Majefty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and Majefty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever (except the Mafter-General of the Ordnance for His Majefty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Two Months, to commence from the Seventh Day of April next, prefume to tranf-port into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coaftwife, any Gunpowder or Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or fhip or lade any Gunpowder or Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms Gunpowder or Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coaffwife, without Leave or Permifion in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act, paffed in the Twenty ninth Year of His late Majefty's Reign, intituled "An Act to empower His Ma-" jelly to prohibit the Exportation of Saltpetre, se and to enforce the Law for empowering His Ma-" jefty to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, * or any Sort of Arms and Ammunition ; and alfo *' to empower His Majefty to reftrain the carrying *' Coaftwife of Saltpetre, Gunpowder, or any Sort " of Arms or Ammunition."-And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Commillioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Mafter-General of the Ordnance, and His Majefty's Secretary at Majefty's Iflands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney,

Order in Council of the Third Day of February last, prohibiting the Transportation into any Parts out of this Kingdom, of the Wood called Lignum Vitæ, will expire upon the Tenth Day of April next: And whereas it is judged expe-dient for His Majefty's Service that the faid Prohibition should be continued for fome Time longer; His Majefty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Perfons wholoever do, at any Time during the Space of Two Months, to commence from the Tenth Day of April next, export, or attempt to export, transport, carry, or convey, or lade, or lay on board of any Ship, Veffel, or Boat, in order to be exported, tranfported, carried, or conveyed out of this Kingdom, any of the Wood called Lignum Vitæ, without Leave or Permiffion being first had and obtained of Leave or Perminion being nett had and obtained of His Majefty or His Privy Council : But it is, neverthelefs, His Majefty's Pleafure, that nothing herein contained fhall extend, or be confirued to extend, to prevent any Ship or Veffel from taking or having on board any of the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ, which may be neceffary for the Use of the faid Ship or Veffel during the Courfe of her intended Voyage, nor to prevent the Fu of her intended Voyage; nor to prevent the Ex-portation of the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Islands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the Welt Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies : Provided that, upon the Exportation of the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ to Ireland, or to His

HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council, of the Tenth of February Ialt, prohibiting the exporting into any Parts beyond the Seas, within the Limits of Europe, of any Sheet Copper, or Copper in Boltflaves, Bars, Sheets, Rings, and Nails, or of Copper in fuch a State as may be easily converted into, or made uleful as a Noval Store, will expire upon the Twelfth Day of April next; And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefly's Service, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for fome Time longer, His Majefly doth, therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, and command, The during the Space of Two Months, to command, That no Perfon or Perfons wholoever do, & any Time during the Space of Two Months, to com-mence from the Twelfth Day of April next, prefume to export out of this Kingdom to any Parts beyond the Seas, within the Limits of Europe, any Sheet Copper, or Copper in Boltstaves, Bars, Sheets, Rings, and Nails, or any Copper capable of being converted into a Naval Store, or ship, or lade any of the Articles above-mentioned, on board any Ship or Veffel in order to exporting the fame beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permiftion being first had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act paffed in the Thirty third Year of His Majefty's Reign, Cap. 2. and allo by an Act paffed in the Thirty-fourth Year of His Ma-jefty's Reign, Cap. 34: But it is neverthelefs His Majefty's Pleafure, that nothing herein contained fail extend or be conftrued to extend to the Ex-
