

Whitehall, April 1, 1802.

The King has been pleased to grant unto Sir Robert Lathropp Murray, of Seymour-Street, Portman-Square, and of the Hermitage, in the County of Berks, Baronet of North Britain, His Royal Licence and Authority, that he and his Issue by Katherine Clarke his Wife, only Child and Heir of Thomas Clarke, of Hailthan, in the County of Sussex, Esquire, deceased, by Katherine his Wife, Daughter and sole Heir of Richard Brown, late of Golden-Square and Stamford-Hill, both in the County of Middlesex, Esq; also deceased, may assume, take, and use the Surnames of Brown-Clarke, and bear the Arms of Brown and Clarke, out of Respect to the Memory of his said Wife's Father and Grandfather; provided such Arms be first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the Herald's Office:

And also to order His Majesty's Concession and Declaration to be registered in the College of Arms.

THE Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury having appointed Money for the Payment of Half-Pay to Sea Officers from the 1st July to the 31st December 1801, according to His Majesty's Establishment on that Behalf; These are to give Notice, that the several Payments will begin to be made at the Pay Office, by the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy, at Ten o'Clock in the Morning, on the following Days, viz.

On Monday the 5th April, to Admirals, Captains, and their Attornies.

On Tuesday the 6th, and Wednesday the 7th April, to Lieutenants and their Attornies.

On Thursday the 8th of April, to Masters and Surgeons, and their Attornies.

After which the List will be recalled the first and third Wednesdays in every Month, that all Persons may then and there attend to receive what may become payable to them, and not only bring with them the Affidavit required, touching their not having enjoyed the Benefit of any public Employment, either at Sea or on Shore during the Time they are to be paid their Half-Pay, but also to produce Certificates that they have subscribed to the Test and taken the Oaths of Allegiance required by Act of Parliament, to His present Majesty; and in case any of the said Officers should not be able to attend themselves but employ Attornies for that Purpose, that the said Attornies do produce the like Certificates and Affidavits from the Persons they are employed by.

Where Officers are Abroad, on Leave, their Agents are to produce Attested Copies of such Leave before the Half Pay can be paid.

And as by Act of Parliament passed in the Thirty-fifth Year of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for establishing a more easy and expeditious Method for the Payment of Officers belonging to His Majesty's Navy," it is enacted by the 20th Clause of the said Act, "that if any Commissioned or Warrant Naval Officer who shall be entitled to receive Half-Pay, and shall be desirous to receive and be paid the same at or near the Place of his Residence, he may apply to the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy, in London, to have such Half-Pay paid at or near the Place of his Residence, in the Manner pointed out by the said Act."

Notice is hereby further given, that the Half-Pay ending the 31st December 1801, will commence paying on the 5th April next, and all Persons desirous of having their Half-Pay remitted to them may apply as above directed.
