**APPRENTICE DUTY INDEMNITY.**

Stamp Office, Somerset-Place, March 29, 1802.

**H**IS Majesty's Commissioners for managing the Stamp Duties do hereby give Notice, That by a Clause in an Act of the present Session of Parliament, it is enacted, for the Relief of all Persons who have omitted to pay the several Rates and Duties, or any Part thereof, upon Monies given, paid, or contracted for, with Clerks, Apprentices, or Servants, and also who have omitted to insert and write in Words at Length in Indentures or other Writings relating to the Service of any Clerk, Apprentice, or Servant, the full Sum or Sums of Money, or any Part thereof, received or contracted for, with or in relation to every such Clerk, Apprentice, or Servant, that, upon Payment of double the Rates and Duties upon the Monies, or such Part of the Monies, so omitted or neglected to be paid, and also so omitted to be inserted and written in such Indenture or Writing, on or before the 24th Day of December next, to the proper Officer, and tendering the same to be stamped at this Office, every such Indenture or other Writing shall be good and valid, and the Persons so offending be excused from any Penalty incurred by the Omission thereof; except those against whom any Prosecution shall be now depending.

Navy-Office, March 29, 1802.

**T**HE Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury having appointed Money for the Payment of Half-Pay to Sea Officers from the 1st July to the 31st December 1801, according to His Majesty's Establishment on that Behalf; These are to give Notice, that the several Payments will begin to be made at the Pay Office, by the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy, at Ten o'Clock in the Morning, on the following Days, viz.

On Monday the 5th April, to Admirals, Captains, and their Attornies.

On Tuesday the 6th, and Wednesday the 7th April, to Lieutenants and their Attornies.

On Thursday the 8th of April, to Masters and Surgeons, and their Attornies.

After which the List will be recalled the first and third Wednesdays in every Month, that all Persons may then and there attend to receive what may become payable to them, and not only bring with them the Affidavit required, touching their not having enjoyed the Benefit of any public Employment, either at Sea or on Shore during the Time they are to be paid their Half-Pay, but also to produce Certificates, that they have subscribed to the Test and taken the Oaths of Allegiance required by Act of Parliament, to His present Majesty; and in case any of the said Officers should not be able to attend themselves but employ Attornies for that Purpose, that the said Attornies do produce the like Certificates and Affidavits from the Persons they are employed by.

Where Officers are Abroad, on Leave, their Agents are to produce Attested Copies of such Leave before the Half Pay can be paid.

And as by Act of Parliament passed in the Thirty-fifth Year of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for establishing a more easy and expeditious Method for the Payment of Officers belonging to His Majesty's Navy," it is enacted by the 20th Clause of the said Act, "that if any Commissioned or Warrant Naval Officer who shall be entitled to receive Half-Pay, and shall be desirous to receive and be paid the same at or near the Place of his Residence, he may apply to the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy, in London, to have such Half-Pay paid at or near the Place of his Residence, in the Manner pointed out by the said Act."

Notice is hereby further given, that the Half-Pay ending the 31st December 1801, will commence paying on the 5th April next, and all Persons desirous of having their Half-Pay remitted to them may apply as above directed.
