The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majefly's Order in Council of the Third Day of February laft, prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coaftwife, Gunpowder or Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the Seventh Day of April next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service that the faid Prohibition fhould be continued for fome Time longer; His Majefty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command that no Perform or Performs whatforever command, that no Perfon or Perfons whatloever (except the Mafter General of the Ordnance for His Majefty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Two Months, to commence from the Seventh Day of April next, prefume 'to tranf-port into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coaftwife, any Gunpowder or Saltpetre, or any Coattwile, any Gunpowder or Satpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or thip or lade any Gunpowder or Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammuniticn, on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the fame into any Parts be-yond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coaftwife, without Leone or Parmiffun in that Babalf full without Leave or Permiffion in that Behalf firlt obtained from His Majetty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act, palied in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majelty's Reign, intituled "An Act to empower His Ma-" jelly to prohibit the Exportation of Saltpetre, " and to enforce the Law for empowering His Ma-" jefty to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, " or any Sort of Arms and Ammunition; and alfo "to empower His Majelty to reftrain the carrying "Coaftwife of Saltpetre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition."-And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commiffioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at

MTHEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty*6 Order in Council of the Third Day of February laft, prohibiting the Transportation into any Parts out of this Kingdom, of the Wood called Lig-num. Vitæ, will expire upon the Tenth Day of April next: And whereas it is judged expe-dient for His Majefty's Service that the faid Pro-hibition should be continued for fome Time longer; His Majefty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whofoever do, at any Time during the Space of Two Months, to commence from the Tenth Day of April next, export, or attempt to export, transport, carry, or convey, or lade, or lay on board of any Ship, Veffel, or Boat, in order to be exported, trans-ported, carried, or conveyed out of this Kingdom, any of the Wood called Lignum Virg. without ported, carried, or conveyed out of this Kingdom, any of the Wood called Lignum Vitæ, without Leave or Permiffion being first had and obtained of His Majesty or His Privy Council : But it is, neverthelefs, His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to prevent any Ship or Vessel from taking or having on board any of the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ, which may be necessary for the Uite of the faid Ship or Vessel during the Courfe of her intended Voyage or no to prevent the Far of her intended Voyage; nor to prevent the Ex-portation of the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ, to Ireland, or to His Majefty's Islands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, or to His Majefty's Colonies or Plantations in America or (the Weft Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His, Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indiess Provided that, upon the Exportation of the fail Wood called Lignum Vitæ to Ireland, or to His Majelty's Islands of Guernley, Jerley, Alderacy,
