The KING's Most Excellent Majefty in Council.

TTHEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council, of the Tenth of February laft, prohibiting the exporting into any Parts beyond the Seas, within the Limits of Europe, of any Sheet Copper, or Copper in Boltflaves, Bars, Sheets, Rings, and Nails, or of Copper in fuch a State as may be eafily converted into, or made uleful as a Naval Store, will expire upon the Twelfth Day of April next; And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, that the faid Prohibition flould be continued for fome Time longer, His Majefty doth, therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, and command, That no Perfon or Perfons wholoever do, at any Time during the Space of Two Months, to com-mence from the Twelfth Day of April next, prefume to export out of this Kingdom to any Parts beyond the Seas, within the Limits of Europe, any Sheet Copper, or Copper in Boltflaves, Bars, Shee's, Rings, and Nails, or any Copper capable of being converted into a Naval Store, or fhip, or lade any of the Articles above mentioned, on board any Ship or Veffel in order to exporting the fame beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permiffion being first had and obtained from His Majefty or His Privy Conneil, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act paff.d in the Thirty third Year of His M. jefty's Reign, Cap. 2. and also by an Act paffed in the Thirty-fourth Year of His Majesty's Reign, Cap. 34 : But it is nevertheles His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend or be construed to extend to the Ex-portation of any of the aforefaid Articles from Great Britain to Ireland, or from Ireland to Great Britain, respectively, or to any Exportation of any of the faid Articles, by, or on board of His Majefty's Ships of War, or any other Ships, or Veffels, or Boats in the Service of His Majeily, or employed or freighted by His Majelty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commiffioners of His Majefty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Veffel from taking or

T the Court at St. Jamer's, the 24th of March 1802, P R E S E N T, P R E S E N T, Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or from the Commiffioners of the Admiralty for the Time being, or from the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland; nor ta the Exportation of the laid feveral Articles to His Majefty's Yards and Garrifons within the Limits of Europe, nor to the Exportation of any of the of Europe, nor to the Exportation of any of the faid Articles to any Port or Place without the Limits of Europe, provided that in cafe of the Exportation to any Port or Place without the Li-mits of Europe, either of Copper being a Naval Store, or of Copper capable of being converted into a Naval Store, the Exporters thereof do first make Oath of the true Defination of the faid Artilces to the Port or Place without the Limits of Europe, for which the fame shall respectively be entered outwards, before the Entry of the fame fhall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commiffioners of His Majelly's Cultoms in Great Britain, or to the Commiffioners of His Majefty's Revenue in Ireland. as the Cafe may be, to carry the faid Articles to the Port or Place, without the Limits of Europe, for which the fame shall respectively be entered out-wards, and such Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in Great Britain, or of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Revenue in Ireland, as the Cafe may be, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commiffioners respectively, and specified in fuch Bond of a Certificate or Certificates in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Cominissioners refpectively, as the Cafe may be, thereby thewing that the faid Articles have been duly landed at the Post or Place, without the Limits of Europe, for which they were respectively entered outwards : And the Right Honorable the Lords Commillionand the Right Analysis Treafing, the Committioners, for executing the Office of Lord High Admital of Great Britain, the Lord Lieutenant of Ireiand, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Perts, are to ste the necessary Directions herein as to them may refpectively appertain.
