The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THIS Day the Right Honorable Edward Lord Ellenborough, Lord Chief Justice of His Majesty's Court of King's Bench, was, by His Majesty's Command, sworn of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and took his Place at the Board accordingly.

Extract of a Letter from His Excellency Lord St. Helen's to the Right Honorable Lord Hawkebury, dated Moscow, October 28, 1801.

I Have the Honor to transmit to your Lordship, by this Messenger, the Additional Articles to the Convention of the 17/5th June, which have been signed by myself and the Plenipotentiaries of this Crown; together with an Act which I have also concluded with the Danish Plenipotentiary, containing the Accession of that Court to the said Convention and Additional Articles, and its Acceptance on the Part of His Majesty.

Extract of a Letter from His Excellency Lord St. Helen's to the Right Honorable Lord Hawkebury, dated Petersburg, April 2, 1802.

I Have the Satisfaction of transmitting to your Lordship the Swedish Act of Accession to the Convention of the 17/5th June 1801, which was signed (with its Duplicate) on the 30th past, by myself, and the Baron de Stedingk; and Instruments of a like Tenor were at the same Time interchanged between that Minister and the Plenipotentiaries of His Imperial Majesty. I have moreover the Satisfaction of being enabled to assure your Lordship, that the Swedish Ambassador has been distinctly informed by the Count de Kotschoubey, that as the Motives which had occasioned the late Revival of the System of the Armed Neutrality were now happily done away, that System is considered by this Court as completely annulled and abandoned, not only as a general Code of Maritime Law, but even in its more limited Meaning of a specifick Engagement between Russia and the other Confederates.

Whitehall, April 19, 1802.

The King has been pleased to grant unto Captain Thomas Louis, of the Royal Navy, his Royal Licence and Permission to accept the Rank of Commander of the Order of St. Ferdinand and of Merit, which it is the Intention of Ferdinand the Fourth, King of the Two Sicilies, to confer upon him; and to bear the Insignia of Commander of the said Order:

And also to command, that this His Majesty's Concession and Declaration, together with the relative Documents, be registered in His College of Arms.

Whitehall, April 24, 1802.

The King has been graciously pleased to grant unto Richard Newman Toll, of Thornbury Park, in the County of Gloucester, and of Hamilton, in North Britain, Doctor of Physick, Third but Se-

cond surviving Son of Ashburnham Toll, late of Northampton, Attorney at Law, and Grandson of Ashburnham Toll, sometime of Graywell, in the County of Southampton, Esq; by Anne his Wife, Sister of Sir Richard Newman, Bart. deceased, His Royal Licence and Authority that he and his Issue may take and use the Surname and bear the Arms of Newman only, in compliance with the Limitations contained in the Will of his Relation Frances Newman, late of Old Palace-Yard, Westminster, in the County of Middlesex, Spilster, deceased, who was daughter of the said Sir Richard Newman, and Sister and Heir of Sir Samwell Newman, Baronets; such Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the Herald's Office:

And also to order, that this His Majesty's Concession and Declaration be registered in His College of Arms.

Whitehall, April 24, 1802.

The King has been pleased to grant unto Edmund Henn, of Whiteleigh-House, in the County of Devon, Esq; His Royal Licence and Authority that he and his Issue may assume and take the Surname of Gennys, and bear the Arms of Gennys and Henn quarterly, (he having intermarried with Mary, only Daughter and sole Heir of John Gennys, late of Whiteleigh-House aforesaid, Esq; deceased,) provided that this His Majesty's Concession and Declaration be registered in the College of Arms, otherwise to be void, and of none Effect.

The King has been pleased to constitute and appoint the Right Honorable Francis Lord Napier to be His Majesty's High Commissioner to the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland.

But at present I cannot let you know: But I Beleve it will be Greate Sevaritys for they will Componhim as a theste in the night

Pleaie to take this as from a frind I Be Chance Saw it in a letter

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in writing and sending the Letter above-mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any One of them, (except the Person who actually wrote the same,) who shall discover his or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein,

so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

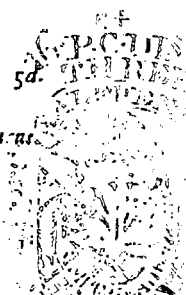

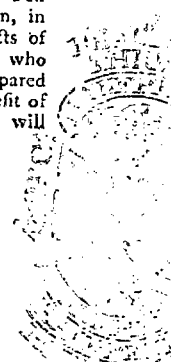
