## A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.

**W**HEREAS a Definitive Treaty of Peace and Friendship between Us, the French Republick, His Catholick Majesty, and the Batavian Republick, hath been concluded at Amiens, on the Twenty-seventh Day of March last, and the Ratifications thereof have been duly exchanged: In Conformity thereunto, We have thought fit hereby to command that the same be published throughout all Our Dominions: And We do declare to all Our loving Subjects Our Will and Pleasure, that the said Treaty of Peace and Friendship be observed inviolably as well by Sea as Land, and in all Places whatsoever; strictly charging and commanding all Our loving Subjects to take Notice hereof, and to conform themselves thereunto accordingly.

## A PROCLAMATION, *Declaring the Conclusion of the War.*

GEORGE R.

**W**HEREAS by an Act passed in the Thirty-fourth Year of Our Reign, intituled, An Act for the further Encouragement of British Mariners, and for other Purposes therein mentioned, various Provisions are made which are directed to take Effect from and after the Expiration of Six Months from the Conclusion of the then existing War, to be notified in Manner therein mentioned; and it is thereby further enacted, that, for the Purposes of the said Act, the Conclusion of the said War shall be holden to be from the Time that the same shall be notified by Our Royal Proclamation, or Order in Council, to be published in the London Gazette: And whereas a Definitive Treaty of Peace has been duly ratified between Us, the French Republick, His Catholick Majesty, and the

Batavian Republick; We have therefore thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, for the Purposes of the said Act, hereby to notify and declare the Conclusion of the said War, by this Our Royal Proclamation, to be published in the London Gazette; and We do direct the same to be published accordingly.

## A PROCLAMATION, *For a Public THANKSGIVING.*

GEORGE R.

**W**HEREAS it has pleased Almighty God, in His great Goodness, to put an End to the late bloody, extended, and expensive War, in which We were engaged; We therefore, adoring the Divine Goodness, and duly considering that the great and publick Blessings of Peace do call for publick and solemn Acknowledgments, have thought fit, by the Advice of Our Privy Council, to issue this Our Royal Proclamation, hereby appointing and commanding, That a General Thanksgiving to Almighty God, for these His Mercies, be observed throughout those Parts of Our United Kingdom called England and Ireland, on Tuesday the First Day of June next: And for the better and more devout Solemnization of the same, We have given Directions to the Most Reverend the Archbishops, and the Right Reverend the Bishops of England, to compose a Form of Prayer suitable to this Occasion, to be used in all Churches and Chapels, and other Places of publick Worship, and to take Care for the timely dispersing of the same throughout their respective Dioceses: And We do strictly charge and command, That the said Publick Day of Thanksgiving be religiously observed by all Our loving Subjects, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and upon Pain of suffering such Pu-



ishment as We may justly inflict upon all such as shall contemn or neglect the same.

**W**HEREAS by Our Proclamation of the Twenty-sixth Day of April last, We did appoint and command, that a General Thanksgiving to Almighty God should be observed throughout that Part of Our Kingdom called Scotland, upon Tuesday the First Day of June next: And whereas it hath been represented to Us, That the said Day will be inconvenient for the Celebration thereof, on account of the Sitting of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland: We, therefore, have thought fit, by the Advice of Our Privy Council, to issue this Our Royal Proclamation, hereby appointing and commanding, that the said General Thanksgiving to Almighty God, be observed throughout that Part of Our Kingdom called Scotland, upon Thursday the Seventeenth Day of June next, instead of Tuesday the First Day of June next: And We do strictly charge and command, That the said Publick Thanksgiving be reverently and decently observed by all Our loving Subjects in Scotland, on the said Seventeenth Day of June next, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and would avoid His Wrath and Indignation, and upon Pain of such Punishment as We may justly inflict on all such as contemn or neglect the Performance of so religious a Duty: Our Will and Pleasure is therefore, and We charge, That this Our Proclamation seen, ye pass to the Market Cross of Edinburgh, and all other Places needful, and there, in Our Name and Authority, make Publication thereof, that none pretend Ignorance; and Our Will and Pleasure is, That Our Solicitor do cause printed Copies hereof to be sent to the Sheriffs of the several Shires, Stewarts of Stewartries, and Bailiffs of Regalities, and their Clerks, whom We ordain to see the same published: And We appoint them to send Copies thereof to the several Parish Churches within their Bounds, that upon the Lord's Day immediately preceding the Day above-mentioned, the same may be published and read from the Pulpits immediately after Divine Service.

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

The humble Address of the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the City of London, is Common-Council assembled.

*May it please your Majesty,*

WE, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the City of London, in Common-Council assembled, beg Leave to approach the Throne with the most lively Sentiments of Allegiance, Gratitude, and Affection, to congratulate your Majesty on the Return of Peace to the United Kingdom, over which Providence has placed your Majesty, not more conspicuously to govern than to bless.

When we contemplate the Nature of the War in which your Majesty has been engaged, the unexampled Difficulties which have attended its Progress, and, above all, the great Object of Preservation which it had in View, namely, the inviolate Purity of that venerable Structure, our glorious Constitution, at once the Palladium of our Liberties, and the Sanctuary of our Alars, what must necessarily be our triumphant Feelings, as Britons, at the Close of this arduous Contest, which inscribes in the Archives of Europe your Majesty's Navy more proudly pre-eminent than at the Termination of any former War, which, to the Name of the British Soldier, gives a Lustre equal to the Glory of ancient Time, and which records the determined Efforts of your Majesty's People united in Arms.

The Voice of Omnipotence has arrested the Devastation of a bloody, extended, and expensive War, and long contending Nations are at length at Rest. Your Majesty's faithful Subjects, who have struggled for the Attainment of this important Period, will, while they appreciate the Blessings of Peace, know likewise to prize its Duties, by which alone those Blessings can be secured. They will perceive that a faithful Adherence to the Laws, and a Reverence for the Constitution that framed them, are inseparable: and that, by their unshaken Loyalty to their Sovereign, their unwavering Attachment to the revered System of our Ancestors, that Constitution has, under Providence, been hitherto preserved, and will be able to stem the Torrent of Ages yet to come.

Your Majesty's loyal Citizens of London renew at this Moment most ardently their fervent Prayers for the long Continuance of your Majesty's auspicious Reign, and for every Blessing which your royal Bosom can receive from the Prosperity and Happiness of a free, grateful, and united People.

**NOTICE TO MARINERS, from the Danish Royal Council of Customs and of the Indies, dated Copenhagen, 6th April 1802.**

**HIS** Majesty having been pleased to order that there shall be a Watch Light on the Northern Coast of Bornholm, to guide the Navigators of the Baltic, we give Notice, That Examination having been made of the most convenient Place from whence the Light might be most distinctly seen, as well by those who come from the West as by those who come from the East and the North, and who wish to pass between Bornholm and the Coast of Sweden, a Light-House has been constructed on the Mountain called Steileberg, which is situated, by the Compass, about a Quarter of a Mile from the Northernmost Bay of Bornholm. In consequence of the Height of this Mountain, this Light-House will be 272 Feet above the Level of the Water. Although it is lighted by Means of a Coal Fire, it is surrounded by a Glass Case or Lanthorn of 14 Feet Diameter, constructed upon a New Principle, so that, in all Weathers, the Flame will rise without Interruption, and the Light will be augmented

by it, because that Part of the Case or Lanthorn which is on the Land Side, and every Part from whence the Light cannot be seen at Sea, is a Wall, the Interior of which is covered with Plates of polished Block-Tin.

This Light-House will be lighted up for the first Time, on the 24th June 1802, and afterwards it will be continued according to the Terms of the Ordinance of the 21st March 1705, and of the Proclamation of the 1st February 1799, so that in Summer, that is from Easter-Day to Michaelmas-Day, it will be kept burning from an Hour after Sunset till Sunrise, and in Winter, that is, from Michaelmas-Day to Easter-Day, from Half an Hour after Sunset till Sunrise.
