A PROCLAMATION, For Diffolving this prefent Parliament, and declaring the Calling of another.

GEORGE R.

HEREAS We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to diffolve this prefent Parliament, which now flands prorogued to Tuesday the Seventeenth Day of August next: We do, for that End, publish this Our Royal Pro-clamation; and do hereby diffolve the faid Parlia-ment accordingly. And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgef-Ies, and the Commillioners for Shires and Burghs, of the Houfe of Commons, are difcharged from their Meeting and Attendance on Tuefday the faid Seventeenth Day of August next. And We being defined and refolved, as foon as may be, to meet Our People, and to have their Advice in Parlia-ment, do hereby make known to all Our loving Subjects Our Royal Will and Pleafure to call a new Parliament; and do hereby further declare, that, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, We have given Order that Our Chancellor of that Part of Our United Kingdom called Great Britain, and Our Chancellor of Ireland do, respectively, upon Notice thereof, forthwith iffue out Writs in due Form, and according to Law for calling a new Parliament: And We do hereby alfo, by this Our Royal Proclamation under Our Great Seal of Our United Kingdom, require Writs forthwith to be islued accordingly by Our faid Chancellors refreetively, for cauting the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, who are to ferve in Our faid Parliament, to be duty returned to and give their Attendance in Our faid Parliament ; which Writs are to be returnable on Tuefday the Thirty-first Day of August next.

A PROCLAMATION, In order to the Electing and Summoning the Sixteen Peers of Scotland.

GEORGE R:

WHEREAS We have, in Our Council, thought fit, to declare Our Pleafure for Summoning and Holding a Parliament of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland on Tuefday the Thirty-firft Day of August next enfuing the Date hereof : In Order therefore, to the Electing and Summoning the Sixteen Peers of Scotland, who are to fit in the Houfe of Peers in the faid Parliament, We do, by the Advice of our Privy Council, iffue forth this Our Royal Proclamation, frictly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to affemble and meet at Holy-Rood Houfe, in Edinburgh, on Tucfday the Tenth Day of August next enfuing, between the Hours of Twelve and Two in the Afternoon, to nominate and choose the Sixteen Peers, to fit and vote in the House of Peers, in the faid enfuing Parliament, by open Election and Plurality of Voices of the Peers that thall be then prefent, and of the Proxies of fuch as fhall be abpresent, and or the Froxies of such as small be ab-fent (fuch Proxies being Peers, and producing a Mandate in Writing duly figned before Witneffes, and both the Confittuent and Proxy being qualified according to Law). And the Lord Clerk Register, or fuch Two of the Principal Clerks of the Seffion, as fhall be appointed by him to officiate in his Name, are hereby respectively required to attend fuch Meeting, and to administer the Oaths required by Law to be taken there by the faid Peers, and to take their Votes; and, immediately after fuch Election made, and duly examined, to certify the Names of the Sixteen Peers fo clefted, and fign and attelt the fame, in the Prefence of the faid Peers the Electors; and return fuch Certificate into Our High Court of Chancery of Great Britain. And We do, by this Our Proclamation, firidly com-mand and require the Provolt of Edinburgh, and all other the Magistrates of the faid City, to take especial Care to Preferve the Peace thereof during the Time of the faid Election ; and to prevent all .



Manner of Riots, Tumults, Diforders and Violence And We firictly charge and comwhatfoever. mand, that this Our Royal Proclamation be duly published at the Market Cross at Edinburgh, and in all the County Towns of Scotland, Twenty-five Days at leaft before the Time hereby appointed for the Meeting of the faid Peers to proceed to fuch Election.
