A PROCLAMATION, For Diffelving this prefent Parliament, and declaring the Calling of another.

GEORGE R.

WHEREAS We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to diffolve this prefent Parliament, which now flands prorogued to Tuesday the Seventeenth Day of August next: We do, for that End, publish this Our Royal Pro-clamation; and do hereby diffolve the faid Parliament accordingly. And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgef-Ies, and the Commiffioners for Shires and Burghs, of the Houle of Commons, are discharged from their Meeting and Attendance on Tuefday the faid Seventeenth Day of August next. And We being defirous and refolved, as foon as may be, to meet Our People, and to have their Advice in Parliament, do hereby make known to all Our loving Subjects Our Royal Will and Pleafure to call a new Parliament; and do hereby further declare, that, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, We have given Order that Our Chancellor of that Fart of Our United Kingdom called Great Britain, and Our Chancellor of Ireland do, refpectively, upon Notice thereof, forthwith islue out Writs in due Form, and according to Law, for calling a new Parliament: And We do hereby alfo, by this Our Royal Proclamation under Our Great Seal of Our United Kingdom, require Writs forthwith to be iffued accordingly by Our faid Chancellors refpecrively, for caufing the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, who are to ferve in Our faid Parliament, to be duly returned to and give their Attendance in Our faid Parliament; which Writs are to be returnable on Tuelday the Thirty-first Day of August next.

Given at Our Court at Windfor the Twentyninth Day of June One thousand eight hundred and two, in the Forty-fecond Year of "Our Reign.

A PROCLAMATION, In order to the Electing and Summoning the Sixteen Peers of Scotland.

GEORGE R.

HEREAS We have, in Our Council, thought fit, to declare Our Pleafure for Summoning and Holding a Parliament of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland on Tuesday the Thirty. first Day of August next enfuing the Date hereof: In Order therefore, to the Electing and Summon-ing the Sixteen Peers of Scotland, who are to fit in the House of Peers in the faid Parliament, We do, by the Advice of our Privy Council, iffue forth this Our Royal Proclamation, ftrictly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to allemble and meet at Holy-Rood Houfe, in Edinburgh, on Tuefday the Tenth Day of August next enfuing, between the Hours of Twelve and Two in the Afternoon, to nominate and choofe the Sixteen Peers, to fit and vote in the Houfe of Peers, in the faid enfuing Parliament, by open Election and Plurality of Voices of the Peers that shall be then prefent, and of the Proxies of fuch as shall be abfent (fuch Proxies being Peers, and producing a Mandate in Writing duly tigned before Witneffes, and both the Conflituent and Proxy being qualified according to Law). And the Lord Clerk Register, or such Two of the Principal Clerks of the Seffion, as shall be appointed by him to officiate in his Name, are hereby respectively required to attend fuch Meeting, and to administer the Oaths required by Law to be taken there by the faid Peers, and to take their Votes; and, immediately after fuch Election made, and daily examined, to certify the Names of the Sixteen Peers fo clefted, and fign and attelt the fame, in the Prefence of the faid Peers the Electors; and return fuch Certificate into Our High Court of Chancery of Great Britain. And We do, by this Our Proclamation, ftricitly com-mand and require the Provoft of Edinburgh, and all other the Magiltrates of the faid City, to take efpecial Care to Preferve the Peace thereof during the Time of the faid Election ; and to prevent all
