PROCLAMATION, For Diffolving this prefent Parliament, and declaring the Calling of another.

GEORGE R.

HEREAS We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to diffolve this prefent Parliament, which now ftands prorogued to Tuesday the Seventeenth Day of August next: We do, for that End, publish this Our Royal Proclamation; and do hereby diffolve the faid Parlia-ment accordingly. And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgef-fes, and the Committioners for Shires and Burgehs, fes, and the Committioners for Shires and Burghs, of the Houfe of Commons, are difcharged from their Meeting and Attendance on Tuefday the faid Seventeenth Day of August next. And We being defirous and refelved, as foon as may be, to meet Our eople and to have their Advice in Parlia-ment, do hereby make known to all Our loving School Our loving the result. Subjects Our Royal Will and Pleafure to call a new Parliament; and do hereby further declare, that, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, We have given Order that Our Chancellor of that Part of Our United Kingdom called Great Britain, and Our United Kingdom called Great Britain, and Our Chancellor of Ireland do, refpectively, upon-Notice thereof, forthwith iffue out Writs in due Form, and according to Law. for calling a new Parliament : And We do hereby also, by this Our Royal Proclamation under Our Great Seal of Our United Kingdom, require Writs forthwith to be iffued accordingly by Our faid Chancellors refpec-tively, for cading the Lords Spiritual and Tem-poral, and Commons, who are to ferve in Our faid Parliament to be duly returned to and cire their Parliament, to be duly returned to and give their Attendance in Our faid Parliament ; which Writs are to be returnable on Tuefday the Thirty-fift Day of August next.

A PROCLAMATION,

In order to the Electing and Summoving the Sixteen Peers of Scotland.

GEORGE R.

W HEREAS We have, in Our Council, thought fit, to declare Our Pleafure for Summoning and Holding a Parliament of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland on Tuesday the Thirtyfirst Day of August next enfuing the Date hereof : In Order therefore, to the Electing and Summoning the Sixteen Peers of Scotland, who are to fit in the Houle of Peers in the faid Parliament, We do, by the Advice of our Privy Council, iffue forth this Our Royal Proclamation, firstly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to affemble and meet at Holy-Rood Houfe, in Edinburgh, on Thefday the Tenth Day of August next enfuing, on between the Hours of Twelve and Two in the Afternoon, to nominate and choofe the Sixteen Peers, to fit and vote in the Houfe of Peers, in the faid enfuing Parliament, by open Election and Plurality of Voices of the Peers that shall be then prefent, and of the Proxies of fuch as shall be abfent (fuch Proxies being Peers, and producing a Mandate in Writing duly figued before Witnefies, and both the Conflittent and Provy being qualified according to Law). And the Lord Clerk Register, or such Two of the Principal Clerks of the Seffion, as shall be appointed by him to officiate in his Name, are hereby respectively required to attend such Meeting, and to administer the Oaths required by Law to be taken there by the faid Peers, and to take their Votes; and, immediately after fuch Flection made, and duly examined, to certify the Names of the Sixteen Peers fo cleeted, and fign and Names of the Sixteen Peers to cleeted, and fign and atteft the fame, in the Prefence of the faid Peers the Electors; and return fuch Certificate into Our High Court of Chancery of Great Britain. And We do, by this Our Proclamation, firielly com-mand and require the Provoit of Edinburgh, and all other the Magiftrates of the faid City; to take a efpecial Care to Preferve the Peace thereof during z the Time of the faid Election; and to prevent all p
