## NOTICE TO MARINERS.

Royal Council of Cufloms, and of the Indies, Copen-

hagen, June 3, 1802. IS Danish Majefty having ordered, for the Guidance of Perfons navigating in the Baltic, that a Light-Houfe should be erected upon the ex-treme Southern Point of Fallter, called Giedfer-Odde, and, after having previously confulted with M. Lowenorn, Adjutant-General of the Royal Marine and Chief of the Pilots, the Public is hereby made acquainted, That a Light-Houle has been constructed upon the faid *Giedfer Odde*, at about One eighth of a Mile from the most extreme Point of Land, and although the Light is entirely produced by a Coal Fire, yet Care has been taken to furround it with a Lanthorn or Glass Cafe according to the lateft Invention, of Fourteen Feet Diameter, fo that, be the Weather what it may, a conftant Flame will arife therefrom, and the Light be augmented I thereby, because all that Part of the Cafe which is
