A T the Court at Weymouth, the 16th of August 1802,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

TIS Majesty in Council was this Day pleased to order the Right Honorable the Lord High Chancellor to iffue Writs for proroguing the Parliament, which was appointed to meet on Tuesday the Thirty-first Day of this instant August, to Tuesday the Fifth Day of October next; and also for proroguing the Convocations of Canterbury and York, which were appointed to meet on Wednesday the First Day of September next, to Wednesday the Sixth Day of October next.

AT the Court at Weymouth, the 16th of August 1802,

PRESENT,

'The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS by an Act passed in the last Sesfion of Parliament, intituled "An Act for enabling His Majesty to permit the Importation " and Exportation of certain Goods and Commodities into and from the Port of Road Harbour, " in the Island of Tortola, until the First Day of " July One thousand eight hundred and three, and 4 from thence until Six Weeks after the Commence-" ment of the then next Session of Parliament:" It is declared to be expedient that certain Articles, Goods, and Commodities, enumerated in certain Acts passed in the Twenty-seventh, Thirty-second, and Thirty-third Years of His Majesty's Reign, should be permitted by His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to be imported from Countries and Plantations in America, and the West Indies, belonging to, or under the Dominion of any foreign European Sovereign or State, into the Port of Road Harbour, in the Island of Tortole, one of the Virgin Islands, and to be exported from thence to this Kingdom, in the same Manner, and

subject to the same Duties, Rules, Regulations, Conditions, and Restrictions, and to the same Penalties and Forfeitures for the Breach thereof, as are provided with Respect to the Port of Nassau, in the Island of New Providence, one of the Bahama Islands, in the said Acts, or in any other Act or Acts of Parliament, for amending or continuing the fame, and subject to such other Rules, Regulations, Conditions, and Restrictions, as shall be directed by His Majesty, by and with the Advice aforefaid; and it is enacted, that from and after the passing of the faid Act, and until the First Day of July One thousand eight hundred and three, and from thence until Six Weeks after the Commencement of the then next Session of Parliament, it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to permit the Importation into the faid Port of Road-Harbour, in the Island of Tortola, One of the Virgin Islands, and the Exportation from thence to this Kingdom of all fuch Articles, Goods, and Commodities, as are permitted by the faid Acts to be imported into the faid Port of Naffau, in the Island of New Providence, One of the Bahama Islands, and to be exported from thence to this Kingdom; and that fuch Articles, Goods, and Commodities shall and may be imported and exported in the same Manner, and shall be subject to the same Duties, and entitled to the same Drawback, and shall be subject to the same Rules, Regulations, Conditions, and Restrictions, and to the same Penalties and Forfeitures for the Breach thereof as are provided in the faid Acts, or any of them, respecting such Importation into the faid Port of Nassau, in the Island of New Providence, and the Exportation from thence to this Kingdom, and shall be subject to such other Rules, Regulations, Conditions, and Restrictions as shall from Time to Time be directed by His Majesty, by and with the Advice aforefaid; His Majelly is thereupon pleafed, by and with the Advice of Ilis Privy Council, to permit, and doth by this His Order in Council permit, during the Time limited by the faid Act,
