HIS Majesty in Council was this Day pleased to order the Right Honorable the Lord High Chancellor to iffue Writs for proroguing the Par-liament, which was appointed to meet on Tuesday the Thirty-first Day of this instant August, to Tuesday day the Fifth Day of October next; and allo for proroguing the Convocations of Canterbury and York, which were appointed to meet on Wed-nefday the First Day of September next, to Wed-nefday the Sixth Day of October next.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the last Seffion of Parliament, intituled "An Act for " enabling His Majesty to permit the Importation 44 and Exportation of certain Goods and Commo-" dities into and from the Port of Road Harbour, in the Island of Tortola, until the First Day of " July One thousand eight hundred and three, and from thence until Six Weeks after the Commence-" ment of the then next Seffion of Parliament :" It is declared to be expedient that certain Articles, Goods, and Commodities, enumerated in certain Acts paffed in the Twenty-feventh, Thirty-fecond, and Thirty-third Years of His Majelty's Reign, fhould be permitted by His Majelty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to be imported from Countries and Plantations in America, and the Well Indies, belonging to, or under the Dominiou of any foreign European Sovereign or State, into the Port of Road Harbour, in the Island of Tortola, one of the Virgin Islands, and to be exported from thence to this Kingdom, in the fame Manner, and fubject to the fame Duties, Rules, Regulations, Conditions, and Restrictions, and to the fame Pe-nalties and Forfeitures for the Breach thereof, 28 are provided with Refpect to the Port of Naffau,

T the Court at Weymouth, the 16th of Acts of Parliament, for amending or continuing the fame, and lubject to fuch other Rules, Regulacions, Conditions, and Reftrictions, as fhall be directed by His Majefly, by and with the Advice aforefaid; and it is enacted, that from and after the paffing of the faid Act, and until the First Day of July One thousand eight hundred and three, and from thence until Six Weeks after the Commencement of the then next Seffion of Parliament, it shall and may be lawful for His Majefty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to permit the Importation into the faid Port of Road-Harbour, in the Island of Tortola, One of the Virgin Islands, and the  $E_{x-portation}$  from thence to this Kingdom of all fuch Articles, Goods, and Commodities, as are permitted by the faid Acts to be imported into the faid Port of Naflau, in the Ifland of New Providence, One of the Bahama Iflands, and to be exported from thence to this Kingdom; and that fuch Articles, Goods, and Commodities shall and may be imported and exported in the fame Manner, and shall be fubject to the fame Duties, and entitled to the fame Drawback, and shall be subject to the fame Rules, Regulations, Conditions, and Restrictions, and to the fame Penalties and Forfeitures for the Breach thereof as are provided in the faid Acts, or any of them, respecting such Importation into the faid Port of Naffau, in the Island of New Providence, and the Exportation from thence to this Kingdom, and shall be subject to such other Rules, Regulations, Conditions, and Restrictions as shall from Time to Time be directed by His Majefty, by and with the Advice aforefaid; His Majefty is thereupon pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to permit, and doth by this His Order in Council permit, during the Time limited by the faid A&, the Importation into the faid Port of Road-Hur-bour, in the Island of Tortola, One of the Virgin Islands, from Countries and Plantations in America and the Weft Indies, belonging to or under the Do-minion of any Foreign European Sovereign or State, of all fuch Articles, Goods, and Commodities enumerated in the faid above recited Acts, passed in the Twenty-feventh, Thirty-fecond, and Thirty-third Years of His Majesty's Reiga, as are permitted by the faid Acts to be imported into the in the Island of New Providence, one of the Baliama faid Port of Nassau, in the Island of New Provi-Islands, in the faid Acts, or in any other Act or dence, One of the Bahama Islands, and also the

Exportation thereof from the faid Port of Road-Harbour, in the Island of Tortola aforefaid, in the fame Manner, and fubject to the fame Duties, Rules, Regulations, Conditions, and Refrictious, and to the fame Penalties and Forfeitures for the Breach thereof, as are provided in the faid Acts, or any of them, respecting such Importation into the faid Port of Nassau, in the Island of New Provi dence, and the Exportation from thence to this Kingdom, and fubject alfo to the Conditions, Rules, and Regulations hereinafter-mentioned; that is to fay, that before any Sugar or Coffee, the Produce of Tortola and its Dependencies, shall be permitted or fuffered to be fhipped or laden on board any Ship or Veffel, each and every Package shall be samped or marked by the proper Officer of the Cultoms in Roman Letters, of not lefs than Two Inches in Length, with the Words BRITISH PN.; that all Sugar and Coffee, not being the Produce of any of the British Plantations, Islands, or Territories, shall, upon Importation into Road Harbour, be laid on Land and examined, and shall be deposited in fale and fecure Warehouses under the joint Locks of His Majefty and the Owner or Proprietor of such Sugar and Coffee, and the fame shall not be afterwards shipped or laden on board any Ship or Veffel, unlefs directly from fuch Warehoules (upon due Entry thereof being first made), under the Care and Inspection of the proper Officer of the Customs; and before any such Sugar or Coffee shall be permitted or suffered to be shipped or laden on board any Ship or Veffel, each and every Package fhall be stamped or marked by the proper Officer of the Customs, in Roman Letters of not less than Two Inches in Length, with the Word FO-REIG J; and shall also be numbered progressively : And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majetty's Treafury, and the Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necelfary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain. Downing-Street, August 21, 1802. The King has been pleased to appoint Sir John Borlafe Warren, Baronet, Knight of the Moft Honorable Order of the Bath, and Rear-Admiral of the White Squadron of His Majefty's Fleet, to be His Majetty's Ambaffador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary at the Court of St. Peterburgh.

The King has also been pleafed to appoint James Craufurd, Elq; to be His Majesty's Agent at Rotterdam.

BY THE LORDS COMMISSIONERS OF HIS MAJESTY'S TREASURY,

WHEREAS, by an Act paffed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled An Act to alter and amend an Act passed in the Thirty-ninth Year of His prefent Majelty's Reign, intituled An Act for rendering more commodious, and for better regulating, the Port of London, fo far as the fame relates to the Concerns of the Weft India Dock Company thereby eflablished, and for extending to other Objects the Compensations directed to be

enacted as follows :

" And be it further enacted, That when any one or more of the faid Docks, by the faid recited Act and this Act authorifed to be made and built by the faid Directors, with the Balon or Balons, Quays, Wharfs, Warehoules, and other Works belonging or to belong thereto, fhall be fo far completed that in the Judgment of the Lord High Treafurer, or any Three or more of the Lords Com-miflioners of His Majefty's Treafury for the Time being, the fame shall be fit for the Reception of Ships and Goods refpectively, it shall be lawful for the faid Lord High Treasurer, or any Three or more of the Lords Commillioners of His Majefty's Treasury for the Time being, and he and they are hereby respectively authorited and empowered by Writing under his or their Hand or Hands, to certify and make known the fame; which Certificate fhall be published Three Times at the least in the London Gazette, and in Two or more public Morning Newspapers then usually circulated in London; and the faid Certificate, fo published as aforefaid, shall be deemed fufficient Notice to all Parties interefted of the Completion of the Dock or Docks, Quays, Wharfs, Warehoufes, and other Works, concerning which, luch Certificate of Approbation shall be made; and from and after the Expiration of Ten Days next enfuing the first Publication of the faid Certificate, in Manner aforefaid, all the Rates and Duties by the faid recited Act and this Act made payable to the faid West India Dock Company, for Ships and Vessels entering into and using any of the faid Docks, or any of the Balons and Cuts belonging, or which fnall belong therete, and alfo for any Goods, Wares, and Merchandize which shall be landed or difcharged from any Ship or Vefiel lying within any of the faid Docks, or any of the Basons or Cuts belonging, or which shall belong thereto, shall commence, take Effect, and become payable; and then and from thenceforth fuch of the Quays and Wharfs then made or built by the faid Company; as shall be defcribed in fuch Certificate to be fit for the Reception of Goods, shall be deemed and taken to be legal Quays and Wharfs accordingly; and all the Provisions in the faid recited Act contained, relat-ing to the Increase of Interest or Dividends from and after the Completion of the faid Docks, Cuts, Quays, Wharfs, Warehoufes, and other Works, and for compelling Ships and Veffels that fhall arrive in the River Thames, with Weft India Produce on board, to unload and land the Whole of fuch Produce within fome or one of the faid Docks, or on the Quays or Wharfs belonging, or which shall belong thereto, and for causing the King's Duties in respect of the same to be ascertained at fuch Quays or Wharfs, and not elfewhere, and compelling fuch Ships and Veffels belonging to or frequenting the Port of London, as shall be used or employed in the West India Trade, to ship or take in their respective Cargoes, and be loaded either in some or one of the faid Docks, or in such Part of the River Thames as shall be below the Entrance into the intended Canal at Blackwall aforefaid, thall take Effect and be in full Force and Operation ; and the faid Term of Twenty-one Years, during which the aforefaid Provisions are to be in force, I

made by the faid Act, it is (amongft other Things) [ fhall commence at and be computed from the Expiration of Ten Days from the Time of the first Publication of the faid Certificate as before-mentioned, any Thing in the faid recited AA contained to the contrary notwithstanding."

> We the underfigned Lords Commiffioners of His Majelty's Treasury, do, in pursuance of the faid Act of the last Session of Parliament, certify, and make known, that the following Works made and erected by the faid Weft India Dock Company under the Authority of the faid Acts of Parliament, are fo far compleated, that in our Judgment the fame are fit for the Reception of Ships and Goods respectively, viz. The Entrance Bason at the East End of the faid Works, the Great Dock, Three Warehouses on the North Side of the faid Dock numbered 2, 4. and 8: and the Quays or Wharfs from the North Side of the Lock, at the East Entrance of the faid Dock, along the North Side of the fame Dock, and terminating at the North Side of the Lock at the Weft Entrance of the faid Dock.

### HENRY ADDINGTON. NAT. BOND. J. H. ADDINGTON.

Whitehall, August 10, 1802. W Hereas it has been humbly reprefented to the King, that many daring and alarming Outrages have been lately committed by Perfons unlawfully affembling, armed and diffuifed. And that on or about the jollowing Times, viz.

April 22d laft, A large Hay-Rick ; and a few Days afterwards, a Dog Kennel and Oat Rick be-longing to Mr. Warren, of Warminster, Wilts, was wilfully and maliciously fet on Fire.

May 20, the Cart of Mr. Bayley, of Calltone-Mills, near Devizes, returning from Warminiter, was flopped on the Downs (by Five Men, Four of whom had their Faces difguifed, and a Sixth Man holding their Coats at a Diftance,) and the Driver compelled to leave the Cart whilf the Men cut and otherwife injured the Cloths therein.

June 23, A Gun was fired in the Night into the Window of a Houfe occupied by a Workman of Messes. Bleek and Strode at Warminster: About the fame Time a Rick of Hay belonging to Mr. Dunn, of Trowbridge, was wilfully and maliciously fet on Fire.

June 26, A large Rick of Hay belonging to Mefirs. T. and M. Tugwell, of Bradford, was alfo wilfully and malicioufly fet on Fire; and a threaten-ing Letter was, about the fame Time, put under the Door of the Workshops of, and addressed to the faid Meffrs. T. and M. Tugwell.

June 29, In the Night a Gun was fired into the Chamber of the Dwelling-Houfe of Mr. Henry Wanfey, of Warminster, in the County of Wilts.

July 6, In the Night, a Gun was fired into the Houfe of John Jones, and another, immediately. afterwards, into the Houle of -— Baker, both ;

Workmen to Mr. Henry Wanley; and the fame | Night a Gun was fired into the House of Mr. Stan-«comb, Manufacturer, at Trowbridge.

July 13, In the Night, a Barn, Stable, &c. the Property of Mr. G. Warren, Manufacturer, at Warminster, was wilfully and maliciously set Fire to, and wholly confumed ;-and an anonymous Letter was fent to another Manufacturer at Warminiter about this Time, threatening, by Almighty God, to have his Life within a Month.

July 14, In the Night, the Factory of Meffrs. Jones, Hart, Jones, and Co. at Staverton, near Bradford, was attacked by an Armed Body of Men, who fired many Rounds of Bullets, Slugs, &c. which demolifhed the Windows, and did other Damage.

July 16, This Night Clifford Mill and Premifes, near Beckington, Somerfet, the Property of Mr. Newton, was wilfully and malicioufly fet on Fire and wholly deftroyed.

July 22, The Mills at Littleton, in the Parish of Steeple Ashton, Wilts, belonging to Mr. Naish, of Trowbridge, were attacked by an armed Body of Men, (many of whom had their Faces blacken'd,) and who wilfully and maliciously fet. Fire to, and wholly deftroyed the fame, with the Machinery and Stock in Trade therein to a very confiderable Amount, after which they went away threatening Destruction to other Mills.

July 24, This Night Two Ricks of Hay, the Property of Mr. Newman, Manufacturer, of Melktham, were wilfully and malicioufly fet on Fire.

July 28, The Factory at Staverton, belonging to Mellrs. Jones and Co., was again attacked by an armed Body of Men, who fired from Three different Parts at the Centinel on Duty.

July 29, In the Night, a Dwelling-Houfe fituate at Bearfield, near Bradford, the Property of John Jones, Elq. was wilfully and maliciously fet on Fire and deftroyed.

His Majefly, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Perfons concerned in the Felonies abovementioned, is hereby pleafed to promife His most gracious Pardon to any One of them, (except the Perjon or Per-fons who aBually fit any of the feveral Premifes and Matters aforefaid, on Fire, or who aBually wrote the faid Letters, ) who fhall difcover his or their Accomplice or Accomplices in any or either of the above Felonies, jo that he, the, or they may be apprehended and convicted PELHAM. thereof.

And, as a further Encouragement, a Reward of FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS (where no former Reward has been offered for any of the above Offences, and in Cafes where former Rewards have been offered, and in Cares where former Recourds Dave been offered, a Reward to make up fuch former Rewards Five Hun-dred Pounds,) is bereby offered to any Perfon or Per-fons making fuch Diffeovery as afore fid, (except as is before excepted) to be paid on Conviction of any One or more of the Offenders, by
