By the Act of 42d Geo. 3. ch. 54. It is enacted, that no Person shall keep an Office for dealing in Tickets and Shares, without having first obtained a Licence for that Purpose.

By the same Act it is enacted, that all Tickets deposited with the Receiver-General of this Revenue for the Purpose of being sold into Shares, and which shall be drawn Prizes of 50 l. or under, shall remain Three Days, and all Prizes of 100 l. and upwards, shall remain Fourteen Days in this Office after the same shall be drawn, in order that the Share Holders may have Time to give Notice to the said Receiver-General, not to deliver such Prize Tickets out of his Custody until the Shares are paid or satisfied.

And that no Receipt for any Ticket deposited as aforesaid, shall be transferable, nor the Interest or Property therein assignable in any Manner whatsoever.
