The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS by an Act passed in the last Seffion of Parhament, intituled "An Act for enabling His Majesty to permit the Importation and Exportation of certain Goods and Commo-" dities into and from the Port of Road Harbour, " in the Island of Tortola, until the First Day of " July One thousand eight hundred and three, and from thence until Six Weeks after the Commence-" ment of the then next Seffion of Parliament." It is declared to be expedient that certain Articles, Goods, and Commodities, enumerated in certain Acts passed in the Twenty-seventh, Thirty-second, and Thirty-third Years of His Majesty's Reign, should be permitted by His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to be imported from Countries and Plantations in America, and the West Indies, belonging to, or under the Dominion of any foreign European Sovereign or State, into the Port of Road Harbour, in the Island of Tortola, one of the Virgin Islands, and to be exported from thence to this Kingdom, in the same Manner, and Subject to the same Duties, Rules, Regulations, Conditions, and Restrictions, and to the same Penalties and Forseitures for the Breach thereof, as are provided with Respect to the Port of Nassau, in the Island of New Providence, one of the Bahama Islands, in the said Acts, or in any other Act or !

T the Court at Weymouth, the 16th of Acts of Parliament, for amending or continuing the Argust 1802, fame, and subject to such other Rules, Regulations, Conditions, and Restrictions, as shall be directed by His Majesty, by and with the Advice aforesaid; and it is enacted, that from and after the passing of the faid A&, and until the First Day of July One thousand eight hundred and three, and from thence until Six Weeks after the Commencement of the then next Session of Parliament, it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to permit the Importation into the faid Port of Road-Harbour, in the Island of Tortola, One of the Virgin Islands, and the Exportation from thence to this Kingdom of all fuch Articles, Goods, and Commodities, as are permitted by the faid Acts to be imported into the faid Port of Nassau, in the Island of New Providence, One of the Bahama Islands, and to be exported from thence to this Kingdom; and that such Articles, Goods, and Commodities shall and may be imported and exported in the same Manner, and shall be subject to the same Duties, and entitled to the same Drawback, and shall be subject to the same Rules, Regulations, Conditions, and Restrictions, and to the same Penalties and Forseitures for the Breach thereof as are provided in the faid Acts, or any of them, respecting such Importation into the said Port of Nassau, in the Island of New Providence, and the Exportation from thence to this Kingdom, and shall be subject to such other Rules, Regulations, Conditions, and Restrictions as shall from Time to Time be directed by His Majesty, by and with the Advice aforesaid; His Majesty is thereupon pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to permit, and doth by this His Order in Council permit, during the Time limited by the said Act, the Importation into the faid Port of Road Har-bour, in the Island of Tortola, One of the Virgin Islands, from Countries and Plantations in America and the West Indies, belonging to or under the Do-minion of any Foreign European Sovereign or State, of all fuch Articles, Goods, and Commodities enumerated in the faid above recited Acts, passed in the Twenty-seventh, Thirty-second, and Thirty-third Years of His Majesty's Reign, as are permitted by the said Acts to be imported into the faid Port of Nassau, in the Island of New Providence, One of the Bahama Islands, and also the

Exportation thereof from the faid Port of Road-Harbour, in the Island of Tortola aforesaid, in the same Manner, and subject to the same Duties, Rules, Regulations, Conditions, and Restrictions, and to the same Penalties and Forseitures for the Breach thereof, as are provided in the faid Acts, or any of them, respecting such Importation into the faid Port of Nassau, in the Island of New Providence, and the Exportation from thence to this Kingdom, and subject also to the Conditions, Rules, and Regulations hereinafter-mentioned; that is to fay, that before any Sugar or Coffee, the Produce of Tortola and its Dependencies, shall be permitted or fuffered to be shipped or laden on board any Ship or Vessel, each and every Package shall be stamped or marked by the proper Officer of the Customs in Roman Letters, of not less than Two Inches in Length, with the Words BRITISH PN.; that all Sugar and Coffee, not being the Produce of any of the British Plantations, Mands, or Territories, shall, upon Importation into Road-Harbour, be laid on Land and examined, and shall be deposited in fafe and fecure Warehouses under the joint Locks of His Majelly and the Owner or Proprietor of fuch Sugar and Coffee, and the same shall not be afterwards shipped or laden on board any Ship or Vessel, unless directly from such Warehouses, (upon due Entry thereof being first made), under the Care and Inspection of the proper Officer of the Customs; and before any such Sugar or Cosses shall be permitted or suffered to be shipped or laden on hoard any Ship or Vessel, each and every Package shall be stamped or marked by the proper Officer of the Customs, in Roman Letters of not less than Two Inches in Length, with the Word FO-REIGN, and shall also be numbered progressively: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necesfary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.
