A PROCLAMATION, GEORGE R.

W HEREAS Our Parliament which We fummoned to meet at Weftminfter upon Tucfday the Thirty firft Day of August last, stands prorogued to Tucfday the Fifth Day of October next; We, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, do, for divers weighty Reasons, hereby publich and declare, That the faid Parliament shall be further prorogued on the faid Fifth Day of October next to Tucfday the Sixteenth Day of November next: And We have given Order to Our Chancellor of that Part of Our United Kingdom called Great Britain to prepare a Writ Patent, under Our Great Seal, for proroguing the fame accordingly. And We do further hereby, with the Advice aforefaid, declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure, That the faid Parliament shell, on the faid Sixteenth Day of November next, be held and fit for the Dispatch of divers urgent and important Affairs. And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgeffes, and the Commissions for Shires and Burgs of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their Attendance accordingly at Weftminfter on the faid Sixteenth Day of November next.

Given at Our Court at Windfor the Eighteenth Day of September One thousand eight hundred and two, in the Forty-fecond Year of Our Reign.

A T the Court at Windfor, the 18th of September 1802,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majefty in Council. W HEREAS Information hath been received, that a malignant Fever is now raging in the City of Philadelphia, in the State of Penniylvania, and at Baltimore, in Maryland, within the United States of America; His Majefty, deeming the faid Fever to be probably infectious; doth, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, deem it expedient to declare, and by this His Order doth declare, that

the faid Fever is probably infectious, within the Meaning of the Act paffed in the Thirty-ninth and Fortieth Years of His Majefty's Reign, intituled "An Act for erecting a Lazaret on Chetney-Hill, " in the County of Kent; and for reducing into " one Act the Laws relating to Quarantine, and " for making further Provision therein :" And His Majefly doth hereby order, That all Ships, Veffels, Persons, Goods, Wares, and Merchandife, now arrived, or which may hereafter arrive in any of the Ports of this Kingdom, or the Illes of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, from any of the Ports of Pennfylvania or of Maryland, and shall have cleared out from any of the faid Ports of Pennfyl-vania or Maryland, fubfequent to the First Day of July last, (not having any Person or Persons on board the fame, actually ill of the faid Fever,) do perform a Quarantine of Fourteen Days at the feveral Places appointed, and according to the Rules preferibed by His Majefty's Order in Council of the Twenty-ninth of july One thouland eight hundred, for Performance of Quarantine by all Ships and Veffels coming from or through the Mediter-ranean, or from the Weft Barbary on the Atlantic Ocean, and arriving with clean Bills of Health; but in cafe any of the Crew or Paffengers on board any fuch Ship or Veffel, which shall have cleared out from any of the Ports of Pennfylvania or Maryland fubfequent to the faid First Day of July, and fhill have arrived, and may hereafter arrive in any of tle Ports of this Kingdom, or the Islands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, from any of the faid Ports of Pennfylvania, or of Maryland, shall have died of the faid Fever during the Courfe of the Voyage, the Clothes, and all perfonal Effects which are fulceptible of Infection, worn by, or belonging to fuch Perfon, shall be forthwith burned or funk in deep Water: And if fuch Clothes, and Effects, fhall not be fo burned, or destroyed, the faid Ship, or Veffel, with the whole of her Cargo, shall not be permitted to perform Quarantine at any Port or Place, except at Standgate Creek; and shall be com? pelled to depart from any other Port or Place at which the fame has arrived, or fhall arrive, as afore-faid; and fhall repair to Standgate Creek, and there perform Quarantine, and not ellewbere: And His Majesty is further pleased to order, with the Advice aforefaid, and it is hereby ordered, That if it shall

appear, upon the Arrival of any Ship or Veffel, from any of the faid Ports of Pennfylvania, or of Maryland, as aforefaid, that any of the Crew or Paffengers belonging to the fame are actually ill of the faid Fever, then fuch Ship, or Veffel, and the Perfons, Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, on board the fame shall not be permitted to perform Quarantine at any Port or Place, except Standgate Creek, and shall be compelled to depart from any other Port or Place, and to proceed immediately to Standgate Creek, in order to perform Quarantine, and shall there perform Quarantine, and not ellewhere : And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for ex ecuting the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General, and the Rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majelty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the faid Ifles of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may respec-tively appertain.
