Whitehall, September 25, 1802. TT Hereas it has been humbly reprefented to the King, that many daring and alarming Outroges have been lately committed by Perfons unlawfully affembling, armed and difguifed, and that on or about the fullowing Time , viz.

April 22d laft, A large Hay Rick and a few Days afterwards, a Dog Kennel and Oat Rick be-longing to Mr. Warren, of Warminster, Wilts, were wilfully and maliciously fet on Fire.

May 20, The Cart of Mr. Bayley, of Califou-Mills, near Devizes, returning from Warminiter, was flopped on the Downs, (by Five Men, Four of whom had their Faces difguifed, and a Sixth Man holding their Coats at a Diftance,) and the Driver compelled to leave the Cart whill the Men cut and otherwise injured the Cloths therein.

June 23, A Gun was fired in the Night into the Window of a House occupied by a Workman of Meffrs. Bleek and Strode, at Warminfter: A bout the fame Time a Rick of Hay belonging to Mr. Dunn, of Trowbridge, was wilfully and maliciously fet on Fire.

June 26, A large Rick of Hay belonging to Meffrs. T. and M. Tugwell, of Bradford, was alfo wilfully and malicioully fet on Fire; and a threatening Letter was, about the fame Time, put under the Door of the Workshops of, and addressed to the faid Meffrs T. and M. Tugwell.

June 29, In the Night a Gun was fired into the Chamber of the Dwelling-Houfe of Mr. Henry Wanfey, of Warminster, in the County of Wilts.

July 6, In the Night a Gun was fired into the House of John Jones, and another immediately afterwards into the Houle of ---- Baker, both Workmen to Mr. H. Wanley ; and the fame Night a Gun was fired into the House of Mr. Stancomb, Manufacturer, at Trowbridge.

July 13, In the Night, a Barn, Stable, &c the Property of Mr. George Warren, Manufacturer, at Warminiter, was willfully and maliciously fet Fire to, and wholly conlumed ;---and an anonymous Letter was fent to another Manufacturer at Warminfter about this Time, threatening, by Almighty God, to have his Life within a Month.

July 14, In the Night, the Factory of Mess-Jones, Hart, Jones, and Co. at Staverton, near Bradford, was attacked by an Armed Body of Men, who fired many Rounds of Bullets, Slugs, &c. which demolified the Windows, and did other Damage.

July 16, This Night Clifford Mill and Premifes, near Beckington, Somerlet, the Property of Mr.



Newton, were wilfully and maliciously set on Fire, | diftion of the Admiralty of England, will be held at and wholly deftroyed.

July 19, A large Hay Rick, at Bradford, the Property of Mr. Tanner, Manufacturer, was wilfully and maliciously fet on Fire, and destroyed.

July 22, The Mills at Littleton, in the Parish of Steeple Afhton, Wilts, belonging to Mr. Naish, of Trowbridge, were attacked by an Armed Body of Men, (many of whom had their Faces blacken'd,) and who wilfully and maliciously let Fire to, and wholly destroyed the fame, with the Machinery, and Stock in Trade therein, to a very confiderable Amount, after which they went away threatening Deftruction to other Mills.

July 24, This Night Two Ricks of Hay, the Property of Mr. Newman, Monufacturer, of Melk-Aham, was wilfolly and malicioufly fet on Fire.

July 28, The Factory at Staverton, belonging to Meffirs. Jones and Co. was again attacked by an Armed Body of Men, who fired from Tirce different Parts at the Centinel on Duty.

July 29, In the Night, a Dwelling-Houfe, fituate at Bearfield, near Bradford, the Property of John Jones, Efq; was wilfully and malicioufly fet on Fire and deftroyed.

August 3, An extensive Building, fituate in Trowbridge, belonging to Mess. Naish and Goldfinch, (in which was a confiderable Quantity of Machinery, Wool, &c. belonging to Mr. Naith,) was wilfully and maliciously fet on Fire and wholly deftroyed.

August 31, Two Cottages, a Stable, and Out-Houses, situate at the Common, in the Parish of Warminster, in the County of Wilts, belonging to Mr. George Warren, was wilfully and malicioufly fet on Fire, and wholly dcftroyed.
