WHereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that on the Night of Wednesday the 6th Instant,

a very numerous Banditti came to Boscarne, in the Parish of Bodmin, in the County of Cornwall, with blackened Faces, and otherwise disguised, armed with Guns, Pistols, Axes, Sawes, Bars of Iron, &c. some of whom surrounded the Dwelling-House, and threatened to murder the first Person that attempted to come outside the Door: The Sahnon-Head Wear (the Rocks that prevent the Fish from going up the River) was levelled to the Ground; afterwards they demolished the Hutch in which the Fish are caught; collected all the Wooden Materials, together with the Gates which they overhung from the Fields, on the Estate and the Railing of a large Timber Bridge which crosses the River, was raised in a Pile, and burnt to Ashes;

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the Outrages above-mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any One of them, (except the Persons who actually demolished the said Wear,) who shall discover his or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
