A PROCLAMATION, GEORGE R.

HEREAS Our Parliament which We summoned to meet at Westminster upon Tuesday the Thirty sirst Day of August last, stands prorogued to Tuesday the Fifth Day of October next; We, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, do, for divers weighty Reasons, hereby publish and declare, That the said Parliament shall be further prorogued on the said Fifth Day of October next to Tuesday the Sixteenth Day of November next: And We have given Order to Our Chancellor of that Part of Our United Kingdom called Great Britain to prepare a Writ Patent, under Our Great Seal, for proroguing the same accordingly. And We do further hereby, with the Advice aforesaid, declare Our Royai Will and Pleasure, That the said Parliament shall, on the said Sixteenth Day of November next, be held and sit for the Dispatch of divers urgent and important Affairs. And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burgesses, and the Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their Attendance accordingly at Westminster on the said Sixteenth Day of November next.

Given at Our Court at Windsor the Eighteenth Day of September One thousand eight hundred and two, in the Forty-second Year of Our Reign.
