A PROCLAMATION,

Requiring Puffes, formerly granted to Ships and Veffels trading in the Way of the Cruizers belonging to the Governments on the Coaft of Barbary, to be returned into the Office of the Admiralty of Great Britain, and other Paffes of different Forms to be iffued.

HEREAS by Our Royal Proclamation, W bearing Date the Thirty-first Day of De-cember, in the Twenty-fourth Year of Our Reign, We did charge and command all Our loving Sub-jects who then were, or fhould be, poffeffed of any Paffes for Ships and Veffels belonging to Our Subjects trading to Portugal, the Canaries, Guinea, the Indies, into the Mediterranean, or elfewhere, in the Way of the Cruizers belonging to the Governments on the Coast of Barbary, (except fuch Passes as had been granted to Ships gone or going to the Ealt Indies, or other remote Voyages, where they could not be timely furnished with New Paffes,) that they fnould, before the Thirty-first Day of December One thousand seven hundred and eighty-four, return the fame, and furnish themselves with Passes of a new Form, under the Hands and Seals of the Commiffioners for executing the Office of High Admiral of Great Britain and Ireland, in lieu thereof, for their feveral Ships and Veffels, in fuch Manner as by the faid recited Proclamation was directed : And whereas it hath been humbly represented unto Us, that there is the greatest Reason to believe, that many of Our Passes may, either by Accident or undue Means, have fallen into the Hands of Foreigners, who by Colour of fuch Paffes may carry on their Trade; We, taking the Premiles into Our Royal Confideration, and judging it neceffary to put a fpeedy Stop to all fuch indirect Practices, to put a fpeedy Stop to all fuch indirect Practices, which do not only tend to the Prejudice of Our Trading Subjects, but may occafion a Mifunder-ftanding between Us and the Governments on the Coaft of Barbary, for preventing thereof, have thought fit, by the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation, and do thereby declare, That the Paifes of the prefent Form shall continue in Force for all Vefiels failing from the Ports of Our United Kingdom of Great Brithe Ports of Our United Kingdom of Great Bri-

tain and Ireland, during the prefent Year, in order to give fufficient Time to Our Trade to be furnished with Paffes of the New Form; and that after the Expiration of that Time, no Paffes but those of the New Form shall be considered as valid, except in the Cafe of Veffels returning from Foreign Voyages, where they cannot be timely furnished with New Paffes: And we do hereby further declare, That in the Cafe of Veffels returning from Foreign Voyages, Paffes of the prefent Form shall continue in Force during the Terms hereinafter mentioned; (that is to fay,) For Veffels returning from the Ports to the Northward of the Streights of Gibraltar, or from the Ports within the Mediterranean, in the Weft Indiés, or in North America, to the Thirty-first of March next; For Veffels returning from the Western Coalts of Africa, to the Thirtieth of June next; For Veffels returning from the Eaft Indies, and all other diffant Parts, to the Thirtieth of June One thousand eight hundred and four; and for Vessels which may fail from the Ports of Our United Kingdom previous to the Thirty-first of December next, for a further Time of Two Months beyond the Periods above-mentioned, according to their refpective Voyages: And We do hereby ftrictly charge and command all Our loving Subjects, who are or thall be poffeffed of any fuch Paffes, that they do, on or before the Expiration of the Periods hereinbefore mentioned respectively return the same into the Office of the Admiralty of Great Britain, or to the respective Collectors of Our Cuftoms at the Out-Ports of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, or to the Governors of fome of Our Foreign Plantations or Dominions, in order to their being cancelled; and that they do furnish themselves with Passes of the New Form, under the Hands and Seals of Our Commiffioners for executing the Office of High Admiral of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, in lieu thereof, for their feveral Ships and Veffels, according to the Treaties fublifting between Us and the faid Governments on the Coalt of Barbary, and the Regulations made by Our Royal Predeceffor King George the First, by Order in His Privy Council, on the Fourteenth Day of June, in the Year One thousand feven hundred and twenty-two, fo far as the fame remain unaltered by the Regulations made by Us by Our Orders in Council, bearing Date refpectively on the Twenty-

eighth Day of August One thousand seven hundred and feventy-fix, and on the Thirty-full Day of December One thousand feven hundred and eightythree, and according to the further Regulations then there made, and Our Instructions given to Our daid Commiffioners for executing the Office of High Admiral of Great Britain and Ireland, touching the fame : And whereas many Ships and Veffels belonging to Our loving Subjects, continue feveral Years trading from Port to Port in the Mediterranean, without returning Home, whereby they cannot fo conveniently procure their Palles to be ex-changed; We do hereby, for the Eafe of Our Trading Subjects, publish and declare Our Pleasure, That upon the Application of any Owner of any Ship or Veffel, or other lubitantial Merchant, to the Office of the Admiralty of Great Britain, and Oath made by him of the Property of fuch Ship or Veffel, and that Three fourths of the Company are Our Subjects, according to an AC made in the Twelfth Year of the Reign of Our Royal Predeceffor King Charles the Second, initialed, "An AC for encouraging 44 and increasing of Shipping and Navigation, or fuch other Proportion as may be authorized by Act of Parliament, and upon entering into a Bond for the Return of fuch Pals at the End of Three Years, or of the Voyage, if that fhall fooner deter-mine, it fhall and may be lawful for Our Commiflioners for executing the Office of High Ad-miral of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, or Our High Admiral of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, for the Time being, and they are refpectively empowered to make out a New Pals for fuch Ship or Veffel, and fend the fame to fuch of Our Confuls in the Mediterranean as the faid Owner or Merchant shall defire, with Direction to fuch Conful, that, upon Application to him from the Master of the Ship, for which the Pass is made out, and surrendering up his Old Pals, and entering into Bond for the Return of fuch New Pals, he shall deliver out the faid New Pafs to fuch Mafter, and transmit the Old one, with the Bond, to the Office of the Admiralty of Great Britain : And in order more effectually to hinder, for the future, any Abufes that may be attempted by Foreigners relating to the New Paffes to be iffued as atorefaid; We do hereby further declare Our Royal Will and Pleafure, That all fuch New Paffes, to be hereafter illued for any Ships and Veffels whatfoever, belonging to any of Our Subjects, inhabiting the Town and Carrifon of Gibraltar, faell be made out in a peculiar Form, dif-ferent from the Form of the New Paffes, to be iffued for Ships and Veffels belonging to any other Part of Our Dominions; and that luch New Pailes shall be lodged with the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, or Commander in Chief for the Time being, of the faid Town and Garrifon of Gibraltar, and iffued out only by him, according to the Regulations made by Our faid Royal Predeceffor King George the Finit, and Ourfeif in Council, as aforefaid : And the faid Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and Com mander in Chief, is hereby charged and required, not to iffue or deliver out any fuch Paffes to any Perfons whatfoever, other than fuch as are really Our Subjects, inhabiting in the faid Town and "Garrifon of Gibraltar, and ftrictly to conform themtelves to the Regulations and Instructions made and

given as aforefaid: But in regard it fometimes happens, that Ships, belonging to Our Subjects of other Parts of Our Dominions, call in at Gibraltar without Paffes, and have Occasion to be furnished therewith ; We do, for the further Conveniency of Trade, hereby publish and declare Our Royal Will and Pleafure, That it shall and may be lawful for Our Commillioners for executing the Office of High Admiral of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, or Our High Admiral of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, for the Time being, and they are respectively hereby empowered, to lodge Mediterranean Paffes, of the fame Form with the New Paffes, for Ships and Vellels belonging to any other Part of Our Domi-nions, in the Hands of Our Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, or Commander in Chief of the Town and Garrifon of Gibraltar, with Directions to him to iffue and deliver out fuch Paffes to any of Our Subjects, not being luhabitants of the faid Town and Garrison of Gibraltar; provided the Person or Per-sons applying for the same, do comply with and conform to the feveral Rules and Regulations now in Ufe, and required to be obferved by fuch of Our other Subjects: And We do hereby order, That the Commissioners of Our Customs in Great Britain, and the Commissioners of Our Revenue in Ireland, do caule to be carried into Execution fuch Parts of the faid Order of Council of the Fourteenth Day of June One thousand seven hundred and twenty-two, concerning Passes, as relate to them-felves, and the proper Officers under them, fo far as the fame remains now in Force, and of Our Orders aforefaid, made in Council, on the Twentyeighth Day of August One thousand seven hundied and feventy fix, and on the Thirty-Ind Day of December One thousand seven hundred and eighty three; and that they do direct their Officers in the feveral Ports of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, to demand of the Mailers of all Merchant Ships, fo foon as they shall return into Port from a Foreign Voyage, all Passes granted as aforefaid, which shall be in their Possession, to be produced to the faid respective Officers of Our Cultoms; and if the fame shall appear to be of an older Date than the Periods hereinhefore feverally and refpectively mentioned for the Return of the Palles of the prefent Form, then fuch Palles shall be delivered up to the faid respective Officers of Our Cufforns, and he by them returned to the Office of the Admiralty of Great Britain : And in orfe the Matter of any fuch Ship or Veffel shall refuse to produce or deliver up such Palles, ac-cording to the true Intent of Our faid Order, then the faid Officer shall certify the Name of every fuch Master, and of the Ship or Veffel, to Our Commissioners for executing the Office of High Admiral of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, or to Our high Admiral of Our United Eingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, for the Time being, to the Ead that Directions may be given for putting the Bond, entered into on the granting any fuch Pafs in Suit: And all Our Governors, Lieutcuant-Governors, and Commanders in Chief of any of Our Iflands, Colonies, or Plantations. Confuls refiding in Foreign Parts, and all other Our Officers and Minifters whatfoever, and all other Our loving Subjects whom it may concerna

are hereby refpectively required and commanded to I yield due Obedience unto, and ftrictly to observe all the Orders, Instructions, Regulations, and Direc-tions before mentioned, on Pain of Our High Difpleafure.
