St. James's, November 24, 1802. THIS Day Mr. Otto, Minister Plenipoten-tiary from the French Republic, had an Audience of His Majesty, to deliver his Letter of Recall :

To which he was introduced by the Right Ho-norable Lord Hawkesbury, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and conducted by Robert Chefter, Efq; Affistant-Master of the Ceremonies.

November 8, 1802. HIS Majesty doth hereby direct and require, that all the OUT PENSIONERS of

CHELSEA HOSPITAL, reliding in South Britain, who were difcharged from their respective Corps, as Serjeants, Corporals, Drummers, or Private Men, (thofe refident in London, or within Twenty-five Miles thereof, who are to attend at Chelfea on fuch Days as the Commiffioners of the faid Hofpital shall appoint ; the Out Pensioners from the late Horse Guarde, and Horse Grenadier Guards, the Life Guards, and Royal Regiment of Horfe Guards; fuch Men as, by the Hofpital Books, are now more than Fifty-five Years of Age, or had ferved Twenty-five Years in the Army pre-vioufly to their Difcharges; those who have loft a Limb, or their Eye-Sight, or are Cripples, and the Letter-Men, excepted,) do perfonally appear at the Places, and on the Days, hereinafter-mentioned, in order that fuch of them as, on Examination, fhall be found fit, may be fent to Garrifon Duty, viz.
