PRESENT, 'The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS by an Act, passed in the Twentycighth Year of the Reign of His present
Majesty, intituled "An Act for regulating the
Trade between the Subjects of His Majesty's Colonies and Elantations in North America, and in the West India Islands, and the Countries belonging to the United States of America, and between His Majesty's said Subjects and the Foreign Islands in the West Indies;" it is, amongst other Things, enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty in Council, by Order or Orders to be issued and published from Time to Time, to authorise, or by Warrant or Warrants under His Sign Manual, to empower the Governor of Newfoundland, for the Time being, to authorize, in Cafe of Necessity, the Importation into Newfoundland of Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United States for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland for the then enfuing Seafon only; provided always, That fuch Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, fo authorized to be imported into the Island of Newfoundland, shall not be imported except in Conformity to such Rules, Regulations, and Restrictions as shall be specified in such Order or Orders, Warrant or Warrants respectively, and except by British Subjects, and in British built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law: And whereas it is expedient and necessary that Provision be made for fully supplying the Inhabitants or Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the ensuing Season, with Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, His Majelly doth thereupon, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order and declare, That, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland for the enfuing Season only, Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock may be imported into the said Island from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United States by British Subjects, and in British built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according t

'T the Court at St. James's, the 22d of to Law; and which, within the Space of Nine Months previous to the Time of fuch Importation. have cleared out from some Port of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, or other His Majesty's Dominions in Europe, for which Purpose a Licence shall have been granted by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in England or Scotland, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Revenue in Ireland, or any other Person or Persons who may be duly authorized in that Kingdom refpectively, in the Manner and Form hereinafter mentioned; which Licence shall continue and be in Force for Nine Calendar Months from the Day of the Date upon which such Licence is respectively granted, and no longer; provided that no such Li-cence as aforesaid, granted after the Thirtieth Day of September next, shall be of any Force or Effect: And His Majesty is hereby further pleased to order. That the Master or Person having the Charge or That the Master or Person having the Charge or Command of any Ship or Vessel to whom such Licence shall be granted, shall, upon the Arrival of the said Ship or Vessel at the Port, Harbour or Place in the Island of Newsoundland, where he shall discharge such Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, deliver up the said Licence to the Collector or other proper Officer of the Customs there, having first indorsed on the Back of such Licence the Marks, Numbers, and Contents of each Package of Bread, Flour, or Indian Corn, and the Package of Bread, Flour, or Indian Corn, and the Number of Live Stock, under the Penalty of the Forfeiture in the faid A& mentioned; and the Collector or other proper Officer of the Cultoms at Newfoundland is hereby enjoined and required to give a Certificate to the Master or Person having the Charge or Command of such Ship or Vessel, of his having received the faid Licence so indorsed as before directed, and to transmit the same to the Commissioners of His Majelty's Customs in England or Scotland, or to the Commissioners of His Majefty's Revenue in Ireland respectively, by whom furth Licence was granted.
