P R E S E N T,

The KING's Moſt Excellent Maſteſty in Council.

WHEREAS His Maſteſty, by His Order in Council dated the Twelfth Day of December One thouſand eight hundred and one, iſſued in purſuance of the Powers veſted in His Maſteſty by an Act of Parliament paſſed in the Thirty-ninth Year of His Maſteſty's Reign, and continued by ſeveral ſubſequent Acts, was pleaſed to prohibit the Exportation, and to permit the Importation, and the taking out of Warehouse, of Corn and other Articles of Proviſion, and likewiſe to allow the Importation of Foreign Corn, and other Articles of Proviſion therein enumerated, Duty free, in the Manner therein-mentioned, for and during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the Date of the ſaid Order, which Order was further continued by another Order, bearing Date the Second Day of June laſt, until the Firſt Day of January next: And whereas an Act has been paſſed in the preſent Seſſion of Parliament, intituled "An Act to continue, until the Firſt Day of January One thouſand eight hundred and four, ſeveral Laws relating to the prohibiting the Exportation and permitting the Importation of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of Proviſion without Payment of Duty; to the Relief of Captors of Prizes, with reſpect to the bringing and landing certain Prize Goods in this Kingdom; and to the regulating the Trade and Commerce to and from the Iſland of Malta;" His Maſteſty is thereupon pleaſed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That the ſaid Prohibition to export from any Port or Place in Great Britain any Wheat, Rye, Barley, Beer or Bigg, Peaſe, Beans, Oats, or any Meal or Flour, or Bread, Biſcuit, or Malt made thereof, or any

Indian Corn or Maize, or Meal or Flour made thereof; and the ſaid Liberty to import and take out of Warehouse any Foreign Corn and other Articles, and likewiſe to import certain other Articles of Proviſion Duty free, be further continued until the Thirty-ſiſt Day of March next inclusive, ſave and except the Articles of Rice and Malt; and ſave and except, and it is hereby declared, that nothing herein contained is intended to extend, or ſhall be conſtrued to extend, to affect or apply to any Exportation of Seed Corn from Great Britain to Ireland, or any Importation of Malt from Ireland to Great Britain, in the Manner authorized by an Act paſſed in the preſent Seſſion of Parliament, intituled "An Act for continuing, until the Firſt Day of July One thouſand eight hundred and three, an Act made in the Forty-second Year of the Reign of His preſent Maſteſty, intituled "An Act for regulating, until the Fifteenth Day of February One thouſand eight hundred and three, the Prices at which Grain, Meal, and Flour may be exported from Great Britain to Ireland, and from Ireland to Great Britain; and for permitting, from and after the paſſing thereof, until the ſaid Firſt Day of July One thouſand eight hundred and three, the Exportation of Seed Corn from Great Britain to Ireland, and the Importation of Malt into Great Britain from Ireland:"

And His Maſteſty is hereby further pleaſed to order, that all the Exceptions, Proviſoes, Rules, Regulations, and Reſtrictions ſpecified and enforced in and by the ſaid Orders, bearing Date the Twelfth Day of December One thouſand eight hundred and one, and the Second Day of June laſt, reſpecting ſuch Exportation and Importation, (except as herein excepted,) and the taking the ſame out of Warehouse, and all Matters and Things in the ſaid Orders of the Twelfth Day of December One thouſand eight hundred and one and the Second Day of June laſt contained, ſhall be and continue
