in Force until the Thirty first Day of March next inclusive, in the same Manner as the same are now in Force under the said last-mentioned Order of the Second of June last.

And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treasury are to give the accessary Directions herein accordingly.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS by an Act, passed in the present Session of Parliament, intituled " An Act " to continue, until the First Day of January One 66 thousand eight hundred and four, several Laws ss relating to the prohibiting the Exportation and 46 permitting the Importation of Corn, and for " allowing the Importation of other Articles of 26 Provision without Payment of Duty; to the " Relief of Captors of Prizes, with respect to the " bringing and landing certain Prize Goods in this " Kingdom; and to the regulating the Trade and 6' Commerce to and from the Isle of Malta;" it is, among other Things, enacted, That an Act made in the Thirty-ninth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for enabling " His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation and 56 permit the Importation of Corn, and for allow-" ing the Importation of other Articles of Provi-" flow without Payment of Duty, to continue in 6 Force until Six Weeks after the Commencement of the next Session of Parliament;" which was continued by an Act of the Thirty-ninth and Fortieth Years of the Reign of His present Majesty, and further continued and amended by another Act passed in the same Session of Parliament, and also further continued and amended by Two Acts of the Forty-first and Forty-second Years of the Reign of His present Majesty, until the First Day of January One thousand eight hundred and three, shall be, and the same is thereby, continued until the First Day of January One thousand eight hundred and four; His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, and in pursuance of the Powers given by the faid A&, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, That, from the First Day of January next, until the Thirty-first Day of March next inclusive, no Person or Persons whatsoever shall export, or shall load or lay on board any Ship or Veffel, with the Intent to export from any Port or Place of Great Britain any of the following Articles, viz. Bulls, Cows, Oxen, Calves, Sheep, Lambs, Swine, Beet, Pork, Matton, Veal, Lamb, whether falted or otherwise, or any Bacon, Butter, Onions, or Pulse of any Sort, or any Barkey hulled, or Peurl Barkey,

unless Proof shall sirst be given to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs that the Articles fo to be exported as aforefaid are not of British Growth, Produce, or Manusacture; But it is His Majesty's Pleasure nevertheless, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to prevent the Exportation or carrying out of fuch and fo much of any of the faid Articles as shall be necessary to be carried in any Ship or Veilel, on its Voyage out and Home, for the Sustenance, Diet, and Support of the Commander, Master, Mariners, Passengers, and others on board fuch Ship or Vessel, or for the Use and Suftenance of the Cattle, Live Stock, or other Animals on board fuch Ship or Vessel; or for the necessary victualling or providing any of His Majefty's Ships of War, or other Ships and Veffels in His Majesty's Service; or for the necessary victualling or providing any of His Majesty's Forces, Forts, or Garrisons; nor to prohibit, at any Time, the Exportation of fuch and fo much of any of the faid Articles as may be necessary for the Supply of the British Forts, Castles, or Factories in Africa, or of British Ships trading upon that Coast, which have usually been supplied with the same from Great Britain; nor to prohibit the Exportation by the East India Company, or any Agent employed by them, of any of the faid Articles for the necessary Supply of their Garrisons at St. Helena, Bombay, and Bencoolen, or for the necessary Use of the Ships belonging to the faid Company; nor to prohibit the Exportation of any of the faid Articles to the Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, and Man; or to any of His Majesty's Colonies, Islands, or Plantations in America or the West Indies; or to the Town or Port of Gibraltar, for the necessary Use of the Inhabitants of the same respectively: Provided that the Merchant Exporter, in each Case, do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Places for which they are entered Outwards before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and sufficient Security, by Bond, in treble the Value of the faid Articles, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the said Articles to the Places for which they are fo entered out, and for the Purposes specified and none other; and fuch Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the faid Commissioners as aforesaid, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commiffioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commissioners, shewing that the faid Articles have been all duly landed at the Places for which they were fo entered Outwards:

And His Majesty is hereby further pleased to order, that nothing herein contained shall extends.
