WHEREAS His Majesty, by His Order in Council dated the Twelfth Day of December One thousand eight hundred and one, issued in purfuance of the Powers velted in His Majefty by an Act of Parliament passed in the Thirty-ninth Year of His Majesty's Reign, and continued by feveral subsequent Acts, was pleased to prohibit the Exportation, and to permit the Importation, and the taking out of Warehouse, of Corn and other Articles of Provision, and likewife to allow the Importation of Foreign Corn, and other Articles of Provision therein enumerated, Duty free, in the Manner therein-mentioned, for and during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the Date of the faid Order, which Order was further continued by another Order, bearing Date the Second Day of June Iast, until the First Day of January next : And whereas an Act has been palled in the prefent Seffion of Parliament, intituled " An Act to continue, until the First Day of " January One thoufand eight hundred and four, " feveral Laws relating to the prohibiting the Ex-" portation and permitting the Importation of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other " Articles of Provision without Payment of Duty; 4 to the Relief of Captors of Prizes, with respect 5 to the bringing and landing certain Prize Goods 5 to the bringing and to the regulating the 5 Trade and Commerce to and from the Island of "Malta;" His Majefty is thereupon pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That the faid Prohibition to export from any Port or Place in Brohibition to export from any Fort of Place in Great Britain any Wheat, Rye, Barley, Beer or Bigg, Peafe, Beans, Oats, or any Meal or Flour, or Bread, Bilcuit, or Malt made thereof, or any Indian Corn or Maize, or Meal or Flour made thereof; and the faid Liberty to import and take out of Warehoufe any Foreign Corn and other Articles, and likewife to import certain other Ar-ticles of Provision Duty free, be further continued until the Thirty-first Day of March next inclusive, fave and except the Articles of Rice and Malt; and fave and except, and it is hereby declared, that

Regulations, and Reftrictions specified and enforced in and by the faid Orders, bearing Date the Twelfth Day of December One thousand eight hundred and one, and the Second Day of June laft, respecting one, and the Second Day of June latt, respecting fuch Exportation and Importation, (except as herein excepted,) and the taking the fame out of Ware-houfe, and all Matters and Things in the faid Orders of the Twelfth Day of December One thoufand eight hundred and one and the Second Day of June last contained, shall be and continue in Force until the Thirty first Day of March next inclusive, in the same Manner as the same are now in Force under the faid last-mentioned Order of the Second of June last.

15 thoufand eight hundred and four, feveral Laws " relating to the prohibiting the Exportation and permitting the Importation of Corn, and for 44 allowing the Importation of other Articles of " Provision without Payment of Duty ; to the " Relief of Captors of Prizes, with respect to the "bringing and landing certain Prize Goods in this ** Kingdom; and to the regulating the Trade and " Commerce to and from the life of Malta ;" it is, among other Things, enacted, That an Act made in the Thirty-ninth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majelly, initialed "An Act for enabling ⁴⁵ His Majefly to prohibit the Exportation and ⁴⁴ permit the Importation of Corn, and for allow-⁴⁴ ing the Importation of other Articles of Provi-"fion without Payment of Duty, to continue in "Force until Siz Weeks after the Commencement of the next Sellion of Parliament;" which was continued by an AG of the Thirty-ninth and Fortieth Years of the Reign of His prefent Majelty, and further continued and amended by another Act paffed in the fame Seffion of Parliament, and also further continued and amended by Two Acts of the Forty-field and Forty-fecond Years of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, until the First Day of January One thouland eight hundred and three, fhall be, and the fame is thereby, continued until the First Day of January One thousand eight bundred and four; His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, and in purfuance of the Powers given by the faid Act, is pleafed to order, and it is hereby ordered, That, from the First Day of January next, until the Thirty-first Day of March next inclusive, no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever shall export, or shall load or lay on board any Ship or Veffel, with the Intent to export from any Port or Place of Great Britain any of the following Articles, viz. Bulls, Cows, Oxen, Calves, Sheep, Lambs, Swine, Beef, Pork, Mutton, Veal, Lamb, whether falted or otherwife, or any Bacon, Butter, Onions, or Pulle of any Sort, or any Barley hulled, or Pearl Barley, unlefs Proof shall first be given to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs that the Articles fo to be exported as aforefaid are not of British Growth, Produce, or Manufacture ; But it is His Majelly's Pleafure neverthelefs, that nothing herein contained thall extend, or be con-Hrued to extend, to prevent the Exportation or carrying out of fuch and fo much of any of the faid Articles as shall be necessary to be carried in any Ship or Vellel, on its Voyage out and Home, for the Suftenance, Diet, and Support of the Commander, Malter, Mariners, Paliengers, and others on board fuch Ship or Veffel, or for the Ufe and Suftenance of the Cattle, Live Stock, or other Animals on board fuch Ship or Veffel; or for the neceffary victualling or providing any of His Majetty's Ships of War, or other Ships and Veffeis in His Majelty's Service; or for the neceffary victualling or providing any of His Majefty's Forces, Forts, or Garrifons; nor to prohibit, at any Time, the Exportation of fuch and fo much of any of the faid Articles as may be neceffary for the Supply of the British Forts, Castles, or Factories in Africa, or of British Ships trading upon that Coast, which nave usually been supplied with the same from Great Britain; nor to prohibit the Exportation by the | Parks, Forefis, and Chaces.

And His Majefty is hereby further pleafed to order, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be conftrued to extend, to prohibit the Export-ation from any Port of Great Britain to any Port of Ireland, of any of the Articles above-mentioned, provided the Perfons fo exporting the fame shall enter into Bond, with fufficient Sureties, to the Satisfaction of the Commillioners of His Majefty's Customs, for the due landing thereof in the Ports in Ireland for which the fame shall be respectively cleared ont; and shall also comply with all other Conditions which now are, or hereafter may be required by Law in refpect to fuch Exportation :
