HEREAS it has been represented to His Majefty, at this Board, that the Malignant Fever which fome Time fince raged in the City of Philadelphia, in the State of Penfylvania, and at Baltimore, in Maryland, within the United States of America, has totally ceafed ; His Majefty taking the fame into Confideration, and being defirous to remove all Reftraints upon Trade, fo far as may be confiftent with the Safety of His Subjects, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That the Quarantine laid by His Majefty's Order in-Council of the Eighteenth of September last, upon all Ships, Perfons, Goods, and Merchandizes, which, fubfecuent to the First Day of July preceding, should have cleared out from any of the faid Ports of Penfylvania or Maryland, and had arrived, or which fhould thereafter arrive in any of the Ports of this Kingdom, or the Ifles of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, from any of the Ports of Penfylvania, or of Maryland, be taken off; and that all fuch Ships and Veffels be permitted to discharge their respective Ladings, without unpacking, opening, and airing, and without performing any Quarantine, as freely as they might have done, in cafe fuch Order of the Eighteenth of September last, had not been made, any Thing in the faid Order contained to the contrary notwithftand. ing; Provided fuch Ships and Veffels shall have failed from the faid Ports of Penfylvania or Maryland subsequent to the 1st of December last; and that none of the Crew or other Perfons on board have died or been fick with the faid Fever during the Courfe of the Voyage: And the Right Hothe Courfe of the Voyage: And the Right Ho-morable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's " Malta;" His Majefty is thereupon pleafed, by Ererfury, the Commiffioners for executing the Of- and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. THEREAS His Majefty, by His Order in Council dated the Twelfth Day of December One thousand eight hundred and one, iffued in pursuance of the Powers vested in His Majefty by an Act of Parliament passed in the Thirty-ninth Year of His Majefty's Reign, and continued by feveral subsequent Acts, was pleased to prohibit the Exportation, and to permit the Importation, and the taking out of Warehouse, of Corn and other Articles of Provision, and likewife to allow the Importation of Foreign Corn, and other Articles of Provision therein enumerated, Duty free, in the Manner therein-mentioned, for and during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the Date of the faid Order, which Order was further continued by another Order, bearing Date the Se-cond Day of June last, until the First Day of January next : And whereas an Act has been passed in the present Session of Parliament, inti-tuled "An Act to continue, until the First Day of " January One thousand eight hundred and four, " feveral Laws relating to the prohibiting the Ex-" portation and permitting the Importation of " Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other " Articles of Provision without Payment of Duty ; " to the Relief of Captors of Prizes, with refpect to the bringing and landing certain Prize Goods " in this Kingdom; and to the regulating the

order, and it is hereby ordered, That the faid Provibition to export from any Port or Place in Great Britain any Wheat, Rye, Barley, Beer or Bigg, Peafe, Brans, Oats, or any Meal or Flour, or Bread, Bilcuit, o: Malt made thereof, or any Indian Corn or Maize, or Meal or Flour made thereof; and the faid Liberty to import and take out of Warehouse any Foreign Corn and other Articles, and likewife to import certain other Articles of Provision Duty free, be further continued until the Thirty-first Day of March next inclusive, fave and except the Articles of Rice and Malt; and fave and except, and it is hereby declared, that nothing herein contained is intended to extend, or shall be confirued to extend, to affect or apply to any Exportation of Seed Corn from Great Britain to Ireland, or any Importation of Malt from Ireland to Great Britain, in the Manner authorized by an AC paffed in the prefent Seffion of Parliament, intituled " An Act for continuing, until the First " Day of July One thousand eight hundred and " three, an Act made in the Forty-fecond Year of " the Reign of His prefent Majefty, intituled An " Act for regulating, until the Fifteenth Day of February One thousand eight hundred and three, 44 the Prices at which Grain, Meal, and Flour may " be exported from Great Britain to Ireland, and " from Ireland to Great Britain; and for permit, " ting, from and after the paffing thereof, until "the faid First Day of July One thousand eight "hundred and three, the Exportation of Seed "Corn from Great Britain to Ireland, and the " Importation of Malt into Great Britain from " Ireland :'

And His Majesty is hereby further pleased to order, that all the Exceptions, Provisoes, Rules, Regulations, and Reffrictions specified and enforced in and by the faid Orders, bearing Date the Twelfth Day of December One thouland eight hundred and one, and the Second Day of June last, respecting fuch Exportation and Importation, (except as herein excepted,) and the taking the fame out of Warehouse, and all Matters and Things in the faid Orders of the Twelfth Day of December One thousand eight hundred and one and the Second Day of June last contained, shall be and continue in Force until the Thirty first Day of March next inclusive, in the fame Manner as the fame are now in Force under the faid last-mentioned Order of the Second of June laft.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the prefent Seffion of Parliament, intituled "An Act 14 to continue, until the First Day of January One " thousand eight hundred and four, feveral Laws " relating to the prohibiting the Exportation and " permitting the Importation of Corn, and for

" bringing and landing certain Prize Goods in this ** Kingdom; and to the regulating the Trade and "Commerce to and from the Isle of Malta;" it is, among other Things, enacted, That an Act made in the Thirty-ninth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majelty, intituled "An Act for enabling " His Majefty to prohibit the Exportation and "permit the Importation of Corn, and for allow-" ing the Importation of other Articles of Provi-" fion without Payment of Duty, to continue in " Force until Six Weeks after the Commencement " of the next Seffion of Parliament;" which was continued by an Act of the Thirty-ninth and Fortieth Years of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, and further continued and amended by another Act passed in the fame Seffion of Parliament, and also further continued and amended by Two Acts of the Forty-firlt and Forty-fecond Years of the Reign of His prefent Majetty, until the First Day of January One thousand eight hun-dred and three, shall be, and the same is thereby, continued until the First Day of January One thousand eight hundred and four; His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, and in purfuance of the Powers given by the faid Act, is pleafed to order, and it is hereby ordered, That, from the First Day of January next, until the Thirty-first Day of March next inclusive, no Perfon or Perfons whatfocver shall export, or shall load or lay on board any Ship or Veilel, with the Intent to export from any Port or Place of Great Britain any of the following Articles, viz. Bulls, Cows, Oxen, Calves, Sheep, Lambs, Swine, Beef, Pork, Mutton, Veal, Lamb, whether falted or otherwife, or any Bacon, Butter, Onions, or Pulfe of any Sort, or any Barley hulled, or Pearl Barley, unlefs Proof shall sirft be given to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs that the Articles fo to be exported as aforefaid are not of British Growth, Produce, or Manufacture; But it is His Majefty's Pleafure neverthelefs, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be conftrued to extend, to prevent the Exportation or carrying out of fuch and fo much of any of the faid Articles as shall be necessary to be carried in any Ship or Veffel, on its Voyage out and Home, for the Suftenance, Diet, and Support of the Com-mander, Maîter, Mariners, Paflengers, and others on board fuch Ship or Veffel, or for the Ufe and Suftenance of the Cattle, Live Stock, or other Animals on board fuch Ship or Veffel; or for the neceffary victualling or providing any of His Majefty's Ships of War, or other Ships and Veffels in His Majelty's Service ; or for the neceffary victualling or providing any of His Majefty's 'Forces, Forts, or Garrifons; nor to prohibit, at any Time, the Exportation of fuch and fo much of any of the faid Articles as may be neceffary for the Supply of the British Forts, Caltles, or Factories in Africa, or of British Ships trading upon that Coast, which have usually been supplied with the fame from Great Britain; nor to prohibit the Exportation by the East India Company, or any Agent employed by them, of any of the faid Articles for the necesfary Supply of their Garrifons at St. Helena, Bombay, and Bencoolen, or for the necessary Use of the Ships belonging to the faid Company; nor to pro-** allowing the Importation of other Articles of ** Provision without Payment of Duty; to the ** Relief of Captors of Prizes, with respect to the the Islands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark,

and Man; or to any of His Majefty's Colonics, Islands, or Plantations in America or the Weft Indies; or to the Town or Port of Gibialtar, for the necessary Uie of the Inhabitants of the fame respectively: Provided that the Merchant Exporter, in each Cafe, do hift make Oath of the true Deftination of the fame to the Places for which they are entered Outwards before the Entry of the fame faul be made, and do give full and fufficient Security, by Boud, in treble the Value of the faid Ar-ticles, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majefty's Cultoms, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they are fo entered out, and for the Purpoles specified and none other ; and fuch Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the faid Commissioners as aforefuid, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commif fioners, and fpecified in the Bond, of a Certificate er Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commissioners, shewing that the faid Articles have been all duly landed at the

Places for which they were fo entered Outwards : And His Majetty is hereby further pleafed to order, that nothing herein contained shall extend or be confirmed to extend, to prohibit the Export-ation from any Port of Great Britain to any Port of Ireland, of any of the Articles above-mentioned, provided the Perfous fo exporting the fame shall enter into Bond, with fufficient Sureties, to the Satisfaction of the Commiffioners of His Majefty's Cultoms, for the due landing thereof in the Ports in Ireland for which the fame shall be respectively cleared out; and shall also comply with all other Conditions which now are, or hereafter may be required by Law in respect to such Exportation

And His Majefly is hereby further pleafed to order, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be confirued to extend, to prohibit, at any Time, any Perfon or Perfons from fhipping or putting on board any of the Articles above mentioned, to be carried from any Port, Creek, or Member, or Part of Great Britain, to any other Port, Creek, or Member, or Fart of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, having fuch, or the like Coalt Sufferance, Coquet, or other Coalt Difpatch for that Purpole, and on fuch and the like Security being given for the landing and difcharging the fame, as now is, or hereafter may be by any Law or Laws, Act or Acts, required in relation to the carrying Coastwife any Corn or other Articles, or any Goods, Wares, and Merchandize:

And the Right Honorable the Lords Commif fioners of His Majelty's Treafury are to give the neceffary Directions herein accordingly.
