order, and it is hereby ordered, That the faid Pro ibition to export from any Port or Place in Great Britain any Wheat, Rye, Barley, Beer or Bigg, Peafe, Brans, Oats, or any Meal or Flour, or Bread, Bilcuit, o: Malt made thereof, or any Indian Corn or Maize, or Meal or Flour made thereof; and the faid Liberty to import and take out of Warehoufe any Foreign Corn and other Articles, and likewife to import certain other Ar ticles of Provision Duty free, be further continued until the Thirty-first Day of March next inclusive, fave and except the Articles of Rice and Malt; and fave and except, and it is hereby declared, that nothing herein contained is intended to extend, or thall be construed to extend, to affect or apply to any Exportation of Seed Corn from Great Britain to Ireland, or any Importation of Malt from Ireland to Great Britain, in the Manner authorized by an Act paffed in the prefent Seffion of Parliament, intituled " An Act for continuing, until the First " Day of July One thousand eight hundred and three, an Act made in the Forty-fecond Year of " the Reign of His prefent Majefty, intituled An " Act for regulating, until the Fifteenth Day of February One thousand eight hundred and three, 44 the Prices at which Grain, Meal, and Flour may " be exported from Great Britain to Ireland, and " from Ireland to Great Britain; and for permit, " ting, from and after the paffing thereof, until "the faid First Day of July One thousand eight "hundred and three, the Exportation of Seed "Corn from Great Britain to Ireland, and the " Importation of Malt into Great Britain from • Ireland :"

And His Majefty is hereby further pleafed to order, that all the Exceptions, Provisoes, Rules, Regulations, and Reflrictions specified and enforced in and by the faid Orders, bearing Date the Twelfth Day of December One thouland eight hundred and one, and the Second Day of June last, respecting fuch Exportation and Importation, (except as herein excepted,) and the taking the fame out of Warehouse, and all Matters and Things in the faid Orders of the Twelfth Day of December One thousand eight hundred and one and the Second Day of June last contained, shall be and continue in Force until the Thirty first Day of March next inclusive, in the fame Manner as the fame are now in Force under the faid last-mentioned Order of the Second of June laft.

And the Right Honorable the Lords Commif-fioners of His Majelty's Treasury are to give the neceffary Directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the prefent Seffion of Parliament, intituled "An Act 14 to continue, until the First Day of January One " thousand eight hundred and four, feveral Laws " relating to the prohibiting the Exportation and " permitting the Importation of Corn, and for

" bringing and landing certain Prize Goods in this Kingdom; and to the regulating the Trade and "Commerce to and from the Isle of Malta;" it is, among other Things, enacted, That an Act made in the Thirty-ninth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majelty, intituled "An Act for enabling " His Majefty to prohibit the Exportation and "permit the Importation of Corn, and for allow-" ing the Importation of other Articles of Provi-" fion without Payment of Duty, to continue in " Force until Six Weeks after the Commencement " of the next Seffion of Parliament;" which was continued by an Act of the Thirty-ninth and Fortieth Years of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, and further continued and amended by another Act passed in the fame Session of Parliament, and also further continued and amended by Two Acts of the Forty-firlt and Forty-fecond Years of the Reign of His prefent Majetty, until the First Day of January One thousand eight hun-dred and three, shall be, and the same is thereby, continued until the First Day of January One thousand eight hundred and four; His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, and in purfuance of the Powers given by the faid Act, is plantatice of the rowers given by the late rice, is pleafed to order, and it is hereby ordered, That, from the First Day of January next, until the Thirty-first Day of March next inclusive, no Perfon or Perfons whatfocver shall export, or shall load or lay on board any Ship or Veilel, with the Intent to export from any Port or Place of Great Britain any of the following Articles, viz. Bulls, Cows, Oxen, Calves, Sheep, Lambs, Swine, Beef, Pork, Mutton, Veal, Lamb, whether falted or otherwife, or any Bacon, Butter, Onions, or Pulfe of any Sort, or any Barley hulled, or Pearl Barley, unlefs Proof shall first be given to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs that the Articles fo to be exported as aforefaid are not of British Growth, Produce, or Manufacture; But it is His Majefty's Pleafure neverthelefs, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be conftrued to extend, to prevent the Exportation or carrving out of fuch and fo much of any of the faid Articles as shall be necessary to be carried in any Ship or Veffel, on its Voyage out and Home, for the Suftenance, Diet, and Support of the Com-mander, Maîter, Maviners, Pallengers, and others on board fuch Ship or Veffel, or for the Ufe and Suftenance of the Cattle, Live Stock, or other Animals on board fuch Ship or Veffel; or for the neceffary victualling or providing any of His Majefly's Ships of War, or other Ships and Veflels in His Majelty's Service ; or for the neceffary victualling or providing any of His Majefty's Forces, Forts, or Garrifons; nor to prohibit, at any Time, the Exportation of fuch and fo much of any of the faid Articles as may be neceffary for the Supply of the British Forts, Callles, or Factories in Africa, or of British Ships trading upon that Coast, which have usually been supplied with the fame from Great Britain; nor to prohibit the Exportation by the East India Company, or any Agent employed by them, of any of the faid Articles for the necesfary Supply of their Garrifons at St. Helena, Bombay, and Bencoolen, or for the necessary Use of the Ships belonging to the faid Company; nor to pro-** allowing the Importation of other Articles of ** Provision without Payment of Duty; to the ** Relief of Captors of Prizes, with respect to the the Islands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark,
