The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS it has been reprefented to His VV Majesty, at this Board, that the Malignant Fever which some Time since raged in the City of Philadelphia, in the State of Penfylvania, and at Baltimore, in Maryland, within the United States of America, has totally coaled; His Majetty taking of America, has totally ceated; His Majetty taking the lame into Confideration, and being defirous to remove all Referants upon Trade, so far as may be consistent with the Safety of His Subjects, is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That the Quarantine laid by His Majetty's Order in Council of the Eighteenth of September last, upon all Ships, Perfore Council Marchantines, which all Ships, Perfons, Goods, and Merchandizes, which, fubscquest to the First Day of July preceding, should have cleared out from any of the faid Ports of Penfylvania or Maryland, and had arrived, or which should thereafter arrive in any of the Ports of this Kingdom, or the Isles of Guerosey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, from any of the Ports of Penlylvania, or of Maryland, be taken off; and that all fuch Ships and Veffels be permitted to discharge their respective Ladings, without uning any Quarantine, as freely as they might have done, in cale fuch Order of the Eighteenth of September latt, had not been made, any Thing in the faid Order contained to the contrary notwithstanding; Provided such Ships and Vessels shall have failed from the faid Potts of Pensylvania or Maryland subsequent to the 4st of December last; and that none of the Crew or other Persons on board have died or been sick with the faid Fever during the Course of the Voyage: And the Right Ho-norable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treatury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Wurden of the Cinque Ports, the Lieu-tenant-General and the Reft of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majelly's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the faid respective Isles of l
