WHEREAS it has been represented to His Majesty, at this Board, that the Malignant Fever which some Time since raged in the City of Philadelphia, in the State of Pensylvania, and at Baltimore, in Maryland, within the United States of America, has totally ceased; His Majesty taking the same into Consideration, and being desirous to remove all Restraints upon Trade, so far as may be consistent with the Sasety of His Subjects, is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council to order and is in header and the Council to order and is in header and the same and the s Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That the Quarantine laid by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Eighteenth of September last, upon all Ships, Persons, Goods, and Merchandizes, which, subsequent to the First Day of July preceding, should have cleared out from any of the said Ports of Penfylvania or Maryland, and had arrived, or which should thereafter arrive in any of the Ports of this Kingdom, or the Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, from any of the Ports of Penfylvania, or of Maryland, be taken off; and that all fuch Ships and Veffels be permitted to discharge their respective Ladings, without unpacking, opening, and airing, and without performing any Quarantine, as freely as they might have done, in case such Order of the Eighteenth of September 1981. tember last, had not been made, any Thing in the faid Order contained to the contrary notwithstanding; Provided such Ships and Vessels shall have sailed from the said Ports of Pensylvania or Maryland subsequent to the 1st of December last; and that none of the Crew or other Persons on board have died or been sick with the said Fever during the Course of the Voyage: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Lieutenant-General and the Rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the faid respective Isles of Ronald M'Gregor, Gent.
