THE Hereas by the Third Article of a Convention, concluded at London on the 8th of January 1802, relative to the Sixth and Seventh Articles of the Treaty of Amity, Commerce, and Navigation, between the Plenipotentiaries of His Britannic Majesty and the United States of America, it is, amongst other Things, agreed and concluded, "That all Sums of Money awarded to 66 be paid to British or American Claimants, according to the Provisions of the said Seventh Article, shall be made payable in Three equal Instalments, the first whereof to be paid at the Expiration of One Year, the Second at the Expiration of Two Years, and the "Third and Last at the Expiration of Three Years, next after the Exchange of the Ratisfications of this Conwention," which took Place on the 15th of July 1802: Ordered.
