P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council, bearing Date the Twenty-second Day of December last, to declare, that, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the ensuing Season only, Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock might be imported into the said Island from any of the Territories belonging to the United States of America by British Subjects, and in British-built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, under the Rules, Regulations, and Restrictions required by the said Order: And whereas it may be expedient also to allow, for the ensuing Season only, the Importation of salted Beef, Pork, and Butter for the Supply of the said Inhabitants and Fishermen of Newfoundland, from the said United States into the Island of Newfoundland, under the like Rules, Regulations, and Restrictions; His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, order, and it is hereby ordered, That the Permission to import into Newfoundland, from the Territories belonging to the United States of America, Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, be extended to Salted Beef, Pork, and Butter, for the ensuing Season only, in the Manner, and under the Rules, Regulations, and Restrictions required by His Majesty's above-recited Order in Council, bearing Date the Twenty-second of December last, and according to the Licence thereunto annexed. *W. To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

The humble and dutiful Address of the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the City of London, in Common-Council assembled.

*Most Gracious Sovereign,*

**W**E, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the City of London, in Common-Council assembled, approach the Throne with the most lively and heartfelt Congratulations on the timely Discovery and Defeat of the late traitorous Designs against your Royal Person.

Sensible, as we are, of the Happiness we enjoy under your Majesty's mild and paternal Government, ruling, as we are persuaded your Majesty does, not more over the Persons than in the Hearts of a free and grateful People,—allied as your august Person is to the Safety of our glorious Constitution in Church and State,—and essential as your Majesty's invaluable Life is to the vital Interests of the Empire at large, and of every Individual living under its wise, wholesome, and equal Laws, we are unable, in Terms adequate to our Feelings, to express our Abhorrence at the nefarious and diabolical Machinations which were deliberately planned to overwhelm them all, by one fatal Blow, in Horror and Destruction.

Such Sentiments of Indignation must glow in the Hearts of your Majesty's faithful Subjects throughout the United Kingdom; and we entreat your

Majesty to believe, that your loyal Citizens of London are sensibly alive to the mighty Mischief which threatened them; and that their affectionate Attachment and ardent Zeal will ever, if possible, strengthen in Proportion to any Danger to which your sacred Person may be exposed.

We trust, however, that the firm and decided Execution of the Laws upon the unnatural Projectors of so foul a Deed will, while it warns the Traitor of his Punishment, convince the loyal of the Protection our revered Constitution affords, and effectually secure your Majesty and the United Kingdom, over which the Goodness and Mercy of Providence has placed and preserved you, from any such guilty Attempts in future, to disturb the general Tranquillity.

Long may the Almighty guard the Throne of this Realm from the Assaults of Violence, and the insidious Attacks of domestic Treason; and long may your Majesty, in your Person and Family, enjoy that Quiet and Happiness in governing which are so intimately interwoven with the dearest Possessions of the free and happy People who obey.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

IMPRESSED by a deep Sense of the Divine Goodness to us and to all your faithful Subjects, displayed in its Protection of your Majesty's sacred Person from the recent most wicked and traitorous Conspiracy, we, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Mayor, Recorder, Aldermen, and Assistants of your ancient City of Rochester, humbly presume to offer our Expression of unfeigned Abhorrence and Detestation of a Design equally and desperately criminal in its Means and in its End.

WHEREAS it hath been humbly represented to the King, that Edward Bland Corny, of Broad Street, London, Merchant, on the Twenty first Day of July last, packed up Six Trunks of Printed Goods, and forwarded them to the Custom-House Quay, to be shipped on board the Cherry, for Gibraltar; that the said Trunks were accordingly put on board the said Ship, apparently in good Order and Condition, but when they were opened out at Gibraltar, their Place of ultimate Destination, instead of containing the Goods first packed therein, the said Trunks were filled with Mats, Straw, and Rubbish: And whereas it hath also been further humbly represented to the King, that Messrs. John Mair, Son, Thomas, and Co. of Friday-Street, Cheap-side, London, Merchants, on the Fourth of August last, packed up Two Trunks of Printed Cottons, and forwarded them to the Custom-House Quay to be shipped on board the Gulen for Boston; that the said Trunks were accordingly put on board the said Ship in apparent good Order and Condition, but when they were opened out at Boston, the Port of their Destination, instead of containing the said Printed Cottons therein first packed, the said Two Trunks were filled with Sacks, some Stones, an old Wrapper, and a Broomstick: And whereas it hath been also further humbly represented to the King, that Archibald M'Kean, of South-Street, Finsbury-Square, London, Merchant, on the Twenty-second Day of January last, packed up Five Trunks of Pullicat Handkerchiefs and Cotton Hose, and forwarded them to the Custom-House Quay to be shipped on board the Robert for Jamaica; that the said Five Trunks were regularly put on board the said Ship in apparent good Order, but when they were opened out at Jamaica, the whole Contents were taken out, and in their Place were put several coarse Sacks: And whereas it hath also been further humbly represented to the King, that Messrs. Aguilar, Dias, and Son, of Broad-Street, London,

Merchants, on the Fifth Day of September last, packed up Four Trunks, containing Stripped Muslins, Cambrics, Muslin Handkerchiefs, and sundry Articles of Haberdashery, and forwarded them to be shipped from the Custom-House Quay, on board the Matthew, for Jamaica; that the said Trunks were duly put on board the said Ship, in apparent good Condition, but when they were taken out at Jamaica, nearly the whole Contents were taken out, and the Trunks were filled up with Rubbish;

And whereas His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the Plunder and Robbery of the said Goods, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any One of the Persons concerned therein, (except the Person or Persons who actually broke open and robbed the said Trunks,) who shall discover his or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof. And, as a further Encouragement and Reward to any of the Persons concerned in the said Robberies, ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY GUINEAS will be paid to any Person or Persons (except as aforesaid) who will give such Information as may be the Means of detecting and bringing the Offenders to Justice.
