By the KING. PROCLAMATION,

For encouraging Seamen and Landmen to enter themseives on board His Majesty's Ships of War.

HEREAS it is Our Royal Intention to give all due Encouragement to all fuch Seamen and Landmen who shall voluntarily enter them-selves in Our Service; We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish this Cur Royal Proclamation: And We do hereby promise and declare, That all such Able Seamen not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, sit for Our Service, who shall, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April next, voluntarily enter themselves to serve in Our Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of Our Ships, or Officers employed in Tenders or at Rendezvous on Shore for railing Men for the Service of Our Navy, shall receive, as Our Royal Bounty, the Sum of Three Pounds each Man; and all such Ordinary Seamen fit for Our Service, who shall so enter themselves as aforesaid, shall receive the Sum of Two Pounds each Man; and all fuch Ablebodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who shall so enter themselves as aforesaid, shall receive the Sum of Twenty Shillings each Man, as Our Royal Bounty, such respective Sums to be paid them by the respective Clerks of the Checque refiding at the Ports or Places where the Ships into which they shall be entered, shall be, immediately after the Third Muster of such Seamen and Landmen: And We do declare, That the Qualifications of the Seamen and Landmen fo entering themselves as aforesaid, shall be certified by the Captain, Master, and Boatswain of the Ship or Vessel where they shall enter. And for preventing any Abuses by any Persons leaving the Vessels to which they shall belong, and entering themselves on board any other Our Ships or Vessels, in order to obtain the faid Bounty Money; We do hereby declare and command, That fuch Seamen and Laudmen belonging to any of Our Ships or Veilels as theli abfent themselves from any of the faid Ships or Vessels to which they shall belong, and shall enter them-

felves on board any other of Our faid Ships or Veffels, in order to obtain the faid Bounty, shall not only lose the Wages due to them in the Ships or Vessels they shall leave, but also be severely punished according to their Demerits.

By the KING. PROCLAMATION,

For recalling and prohibiting Seamen from serving Foreign Princes and States; and for granting Re-awards for discovering such Seamen as shall conceal themselves.

GEORGE R.
HEREAS We are informed, That great Numbers of Mariners and Seafaring Men, Our natural-born Subjects, are in the Service of divers Foreign Princes and States, to the Prejudice of Our Kingdom; We have thought it necessary, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation; and do hereby itrictly charge and command all Masters of Ships, Pilots, Mariners, Seamen, Shipwrights, and other Seafaring Men whatfoever and wherefoever (being Our natural-born Subjects), who are in the Pay or Service of any Foreign Prince or State, or do ferve in any Foreign Ship or Vessel, that forthwith they, and every of them, do (according to their known and bounden Duty and Allegiance) withdraw themselves, depart from, and quit such Foreign Services, and return home to their Native Countries: And further, We do hereby strictly prehibit and forbid all Masters of Ships, Pilots, Mariners, Seamen, Shipwrights, and other Seafaring Iven whatfocver (being Our natural-born Subjects), from entering, and do charge and command them, and every of them, from henceforth to forbear to enter themselves into the Pay or Service of any Foreign Prince or State, or to serve in any Foreign Ship or Vessel whatsoever, without Our Special Licence first had and obtained in that

Behalf; to all which We expect due Obedience and exact Conformity; And We do hereby publish and declare, That the Offenders to the contrary shall not only incur Our just Displeasure, but be proceeded against for their Contempt according to the utmost Severities of the Law: And We do hereby declare, That if any fuch Masters of Ships, Pilots, Mariners, Seamen, Shipwrights, or other Seafaring Men, (being Our Subjects,) shall be taken in any Foreign Service by the Turks, Algerines, or any others, they shall not be reclaimed by Us as Subjects of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland: And We do hereby further promise and declare, That a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman at to ferve on board Our Ships, shall be paid any Person who shall discover any Seaman or Scamen who may conceal him or theinfelves, fo that fuch Scaman or Seamen shall be taken for Our faid Service by any of Our Sea Officers employed for railing Men, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April next; the faid Rewards to be paid for any Seaman or Seamen fo discovered and taken in and about London, by the Principal Officers and Commissioners of Our Navy; and at the Out-Ports by the Naval Officers, (where there are any), and (where there are no Naval Officers), by the Collectors of Our Cuttoms, immediately upon a Certificate being produced to the iaid Principal Officers and Commissioners of Our Navy, Naval Officers, or Collectors respectively, by the Person who may make Discovery of any Seaman or Seamen as aforciaid, certifying his Name, and the Name or Names, and Number of Seamen procured in consequence of his Discovery; the faid Certificate to be given by fuch Officer as may take fuch Seaman or Seamen for Our Service.

TO OFFICERS ON HALF-PAY.

War-Office, March 12, 1803. LL Officers on the Half-Pay of the Land A Forces, resident in Great Britain and Ireland, who are not ferving in the Militia, or who do not hold Offices under Government, are hereby required immediately to transmit to the Inspecting Field-Officers of the Recruiting Districts within which they respectively reside, an Account in Writing, of their Age, past Services, and present Place of Abode, in order that their Services may be called for as Circumstances shall render it expedient: And fuch as think themselves, from Age or Infirmities, unfit for further Service, even in this Country, are to accompany their Reports with fufficient Vouchers of their Inability, and the Caufes thereof.

Such Officers on Half Pay as are ferving in the Militia, or are otherwise employed under Government, (Officers of the Yeomanny and Volunteer Corps excepted, whose Reports are to be made to the Inspecting Field Officers of Dillricts as abovementioned,) are to transmit similar Accounts to the Secretary at War, specifying also the Nature of the

public Situations which they possels.

The Inspecting Field-Officers of Districts will make Returns to the Secretary at War of the Names of the Officers who shall report themselves in pursuance of the above Notice. And every Officer who shall neglect to make his Report, either to a District Field-Officer, or to the Secretary at War, according to the Circumstances of his Situation, within one Month from the Date hercof, will be confidered as otherwise provided for, or dead, and his Name will be firuck off the Haif-Pay Lift accordingly.
