-se in this Kingdom; and to the regulating the "Trade and Commerce to and from the Isle of "Malta;" His Majelly was pleased, by His Or-der in Council, bearing Date the Thirty-sirst of December laft, to order, and it was thereby ordered, That the Prohibition laid, by Order of His Majefty in Council, bearing Date the Twelfth Day of December One thousand eight hundred and one, upon the Exportation from any Port or Place in Great Britain of any Wheat, Rye, Barley, Beer or Bigg, Peafe, Beans, Oats, or any Meal or Flour, or Bread, Bilcuit, or Malt made thereof, or of any Indian Corn or Maize, or Meal or Flour made thereof; and also the Liberty, granted by the faid Order in Council, bearing Date the Twelfth Day of December One thousand eight hundred and one, to import and take out of Warehouse Foreign Corn and other Articles as aforefaid, and likewife to import fundry other Articles of Pro-vision Duty free, should be further continued until the Thirty-first Day of March Irst, fave and except the Importation, Duty free, of the Articles of Rice and Malt; and fave and except, as it was declared by the faid Order, that nothing therein contained was intended to extend, or should be construed to extend, to affect or apply to any Exportation of Seed Corn from Great Britain to Ireland, or any Importation of Malt from Ireland to Great Britain, in the Manner authorized by an Act paffed in the prefent Seffion of Parliament, intituled "An Act " for continuing, until the First Day of July One " thousand eight hundred and three, an Act made " in the Forty-second Year of the Reign of His " present Majesty, intituled An Act for regulating, " until the Fifteenth Day of February One thou-" fand eight hundred and three, the Prices at which " Grain, Meal, and Flour may be exported from " Great Britain to Ireland, and from Ireland to " Great Britain ; and for permitting, from and after the passing thereof, until the faid First Day " of July One thousand eight hundred and three, " the Exportation of Seed Coin from Great Bri " tain to Ireland, and the Importation of Malt " into Great Britain from Ireland :" And whereas His Majesty's faid Order in Council of the Thirty-first Day of December last has been further continued until the Thirtisth Day of this inftant April

And whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Prohibition to export, and the faid Permiffion to import, fhould be continued for fome Time longer, His Majefty, therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, and in purfuance of the Powers given by the First of the above-recited Acts, passed in the prefent Sellion of Parliament, hath thought fit to order, and it is hereby ordered, That the laid Order in Council, bearing Date the Thirty-first of December last, and all the Exceptions, Proviloes, Rules, Regulations, and Reitrictions, specified and enforced by the faid Order, refpecting fuch Ex-portation and Importation, and taking out of Warehoufe, fhall be, and continue in Force until the Thirty first Day of May next inclusive, in the fame Manner as the fame are now in Force by the faid Order, bearing Date the Thirty-firl Day of De-cember lait.
